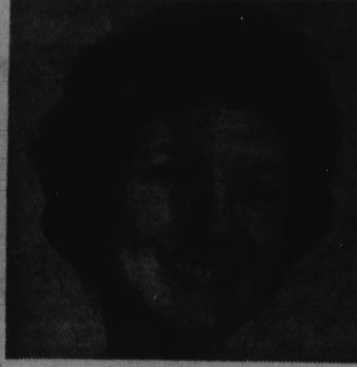
I am acquainted with the doctrine and functions of student government as I have served as council representative for four years.

mittles I will try to keep them functioning properly. And I will do my best to cooperate with the other officers. — Consider Ray Rawson when voting for Student Body Vice-President.

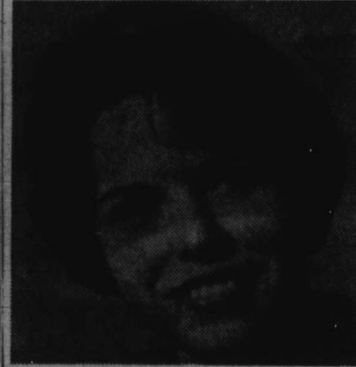


**LOIS ARENDS

I have been elected to various offices in student government and youth organizations sponsored by the school and by my church, but most frequently I have been elected to the position of Treasurer.

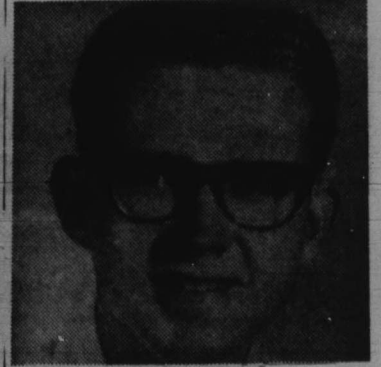
I am acquainted with the principles behind the organization and functions of student government, and therefore, believe that I am capable of carrying out the responsibilities of the office of Treasurer.

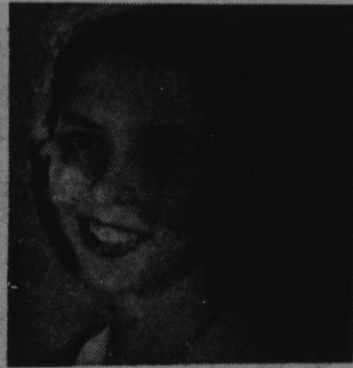

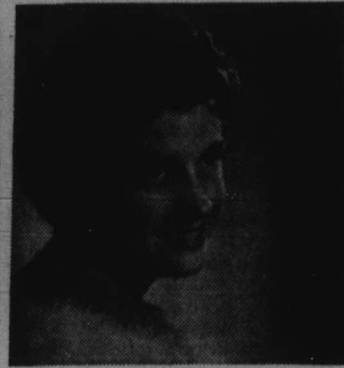

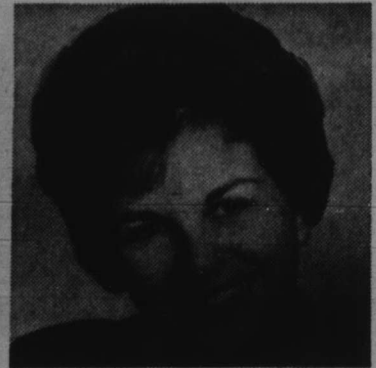

Sports Round Up

The 1960-1961 basketball season came to a close for Coach Mike "Chub" Drakulich and his Nevada Southern Rebels with completion of the Cal Poly Tournament at Pomona. Nevada Southern was defeated in overtime by host team Cal Poly in the semi-finals after defeating San Fernando Valley State the night before. Cal Poly went on to defeat Cal Western University for the championship while the Rebels ran into a hot shooting Orange State team and went down to defeat.

Coach Drakulich can look back on a fine season, his third here at the Las Vegas campus. With a 13 win, 12 loss record and victories over such teams as Arizona State College, Cal Poly of San Luis Obispo, San Fernando Valley State, and Cal Poly of Pomona it looks like Nevada Southern is on its way in athletic competition. It is also noteworthy that of the Rebels 12 losses, 9 were lost by less than 6 points. Injuries in mid-season to such stalwarts as Bernie Fumagalli and Tim Leonard could easily have turned the tide to a better won and loss record. Fumagalli will leave Nevada Southern this year having compiled 1205 points in the three years the "Rebs" have been in competition.

With Fumagalli and Hamel the only losses from this years roster, Drakulich can look to next year with nothing but optimism. Returning are three starters, Leonard, Jansen and Demman. Add to these three two transfers, Don Brady from Montana and Sid Stacey from Nebraska plus the bench strength of McGuire, Shay and Fleming, the Rebels can look for an even more successful season next year.

Scheduling of games for next season is underway. With such fine teams as University of Nevada, Arizona State College, Cal Western University, University of San Diego and Cal Poly of Pomona, already scheduled, Nevada Southern can look forward for another great year in basketball.

As a final gesture in ending the basketball season, a banquet was held at the Showboat Hotel where by the members of the team were honored. At the banquet sweaters were awarded to Bernie Fumagalli, Jerry Hamel, Jim Jansen, Tim Lenord, and manager Corky Poole.

Bernie Fumagalli was also awarded the outstanding player trophy for his efforts of the past three years. Coach Drakulich stated "We were very fortunate to have Bernie on our team for the past three seasons, his contributions to our basketball program will always be remembered. We will miss Bernie next year."

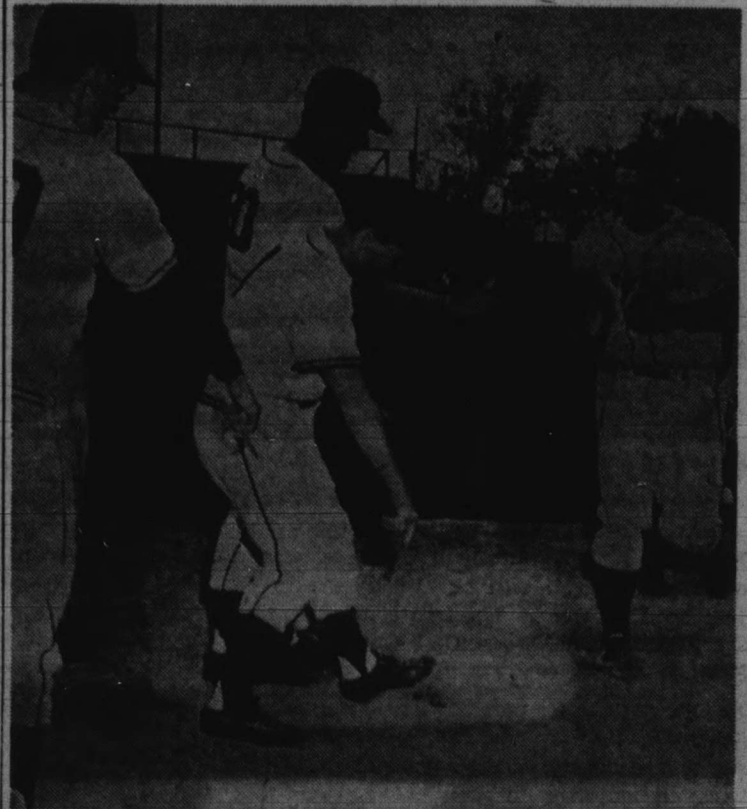
Guest speakers at the banquet were Dean Carlson and Jake Lawlor, the Athletic Director at the University of Nevada, Reno Campus.

NEW CONSTITUTION FOR CSNS

For the first time in the history of Nevada Southern CSNS is operating under a workable constitution. For the past several years the student government has been held back and hampered by a very antiquated and awkward constitution. The student government is functioning much more smoothly because of the revisions that have been made this year. The most important of the revisions have made the operations of the Executive Committee easier and quicker. Many needless procedures and regulations have been either changed or eliminated completely.

One big factor in holding back the Executive Committee is apathy in student government. This we ran head on into in the Senate and the Rebel Yell. At the first of the year we had 15 senators, 5 from each class, at the end of the first semester we had a grand total of 5. This great figure was the result of a combination of two things, grades and apathy, mostly apathy. To help relieve the situation and to insure a workable Senate, we have reduced the number for 5 to 2 for each class in hope of finding at least a few interested students.

The other major change was in qualifications for CSNS officers which are now as follows:

The President and Vice President each must have completed 31 credits and be taking 12 credits at the time he is running for office and while he maintains the office. He must also have and maintain a 2.0 average.

The Secretary, Treasurer, and Historian each must have completed 12 credits and be taking 12 credits at the time he is running for office and while he maintains the office. He must also have and maintain a 2.0 average.
