Intramurals back on right track

Thanks to the efforts of a few motivated students, it looks like the Intramural program at UNLV is on the rebound after last year's disappointing program that included only basketball and football.

New Intramural Chairman Mike Popp, assistant Jack Hardy, and the others at the Intramural office have planned what promises to be the most diverse schedule of intramural sports in many years. Besides the usually football, basketball, and softball leagues, there will be sports offered such as, 2-man

volleyball, innertube water polo, racquetball, and bowling.

And believe it or not, they're actually organized, something new to the Intramural office.

Take for example the flag football program. No longer will teams be notified when they play only a day or two before the games, as in the past. This year a schedule of games for the whole season was set two weeks before the first game. All that needed to be done was the teams placed in respective divisions and plugged into the schedule, thus the teams know who and when they're playing for the entire season.

This year's Intramural office has also addressed a few of the others problems that have hindered the intramural program recently.

Clashes in the scheduling of playing field and gym usage with the Physical Education Department has always been a big problem.

Popp has taken measures to alleviate the situation by entering in joint cooperation with the P.E. Dept. in the running of intramurals. A graduate assistant, Susan Iverson, has been assigned to advise and help out the Intramural office, and serve as

a liaison.

Popp said he eventually wants to see the P.E. Dept. take over the running of intramurals from CSUN to give the program more consistency.

Another change this year, is the including of females in every one of the sports programs throughout the year. Many women were upset last year when they were not included in any of the programs. This was a serious injustice, that excluded the majority of UNLV students, when you consider that women constitute 52 percent of the student population.

Popp also went out and recruited sponsors to help subsidize the costs of intramurals. So far, Budweiser, Mazio's Pizza, Coor's, Showboat, and Scandia, have signed on as sponsors.

"We want to increase par-

ticipation, expand the program, and meet the same standards as a UCLA or ASU," said Popp.

Because of this year's more established intramural program, the Yellin Rebel will give more coverage to the program than in past years, including, articles, statistics, and photos.

Participating in intramurals is one of those things that makes college life fun and adds to the whole college experience, so get involved UNLV students and have a good time.
