Greek Row

How would the row be policed? What rules governed the houses since they would be on university property? What would the money be used for after the 28-year loan was paid off?

Right now Ackerman is leaving it up to the fraternities as to how elaborate and how expensive they want to make the houses.

Last year the university commissioned JMA Architects to produce a report, Greek Housing Hypothetical Models, that could be used as a measuring stick of what the houses would cost. Five different options on the size of the house, 20, 30, 40, 60, and 80, person house were produced.

The price per person for a two-man room under the 30-person option, which most fraternities say is the

size they're looking at, with a base building and no amenities such as a kitchen or chapter room, is \$222 if the house is rented on a 12-month basis.

The house could be cheaper or more expensive depending on what the fraternity wants; and when this study was done, the period of the loan repayment was 15 years instead of 28, which makes the monthly payments cheaper.

Ackerman says that in Las Vegas the going rate per square foot of housing is running about \$40-45.

Other costs the fraternities will incur include \$0.75 per square foot per year for a reserve account for major repairs, \$3.75 per square foot per year for maintenance and utilities and furnishing the houses.

Many of the fraternities

say they will get help furnishing the houses from their alumni and national offices.

"We'd definitely help our chapter out there with a loan to help furnish their house," Alpha Epsilon Pi chapter consultant John Pierce said.

The question of where the fraternities members would eat is also up to the fraternities.

Ackerman said that because the university owns the land and the buildings and the houses will be used by university students. It can be assumed that the university also has liability; therefore, there must be some guidelines the fraternities would have to follow if there was a greek row.

Once the fraternities pay off the 28-year loans, the rent they pay will be used to make improvements to the houses.
