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## NCAA rules restrictive for athletes

Remember when your mother always told you no for this or no for that, but you never really understood the reasoning behind the decision.

Well, that's how I feel about the National Collegiate Athletic Association rules on what a student-athlete may and may not do.

See, the NCAA is the governing body over college athletics, and they enforce rules upon student-athletes that determines their eligibility or ineligibility in a particular sport.

Some of the rules established by the NCAA are: two athletes from the same college teams may not play on the same summer team, an athlete may not participate in more

than one NCAA-sanctioned summer league, an athlete is not allowed to appear as an advertisement commodity for business or for promotional purposes (remember the Brian Boswell ordeal), and an athlete is not permitted to receive more than the monies allotted by the NCAA for financial aid.

This does not include money from anyone whom the athlete is naturally or legally dependent, financial aid that has been awarded to the athlete on a basis other than athletic ability, or financial aid from a program outside one institution that meets requirements specified by the NCAA.

Of course, there are quite a few more rules, to say the least, but those mentioned are the ones that come to mind.

One of the biggest

hang-ups often heard is that the NCAA does not give athletes enough money to support themselves.

I often hear athletes echoing "I can't wait until the first of the month."

To me, it would seem as if the athletes are "just" making it. However, one would wonder how their money is being spent. Are they budgeting their money? Are they impulse buying? Anyway, I think that these problems would be eliminated if athletes were at least allowed to hold a part-time job to earn more income.

Their needs like everyone's includes food, shelter, transportation, and clothing.

I mention this because many athletes attend colleges out-of-state and do not have their parents to support them immediately in those times of

desperate needs.

I also have trouble understanding why an athlete can only participate in one NCAA-sanctioned summer league.

Wouldn't be beneficial to the athlete and university if the athlete play, play, and play instead of limiting the athletes summer recreation to improve his/her game.

A few weeks ago during the halftime of an ABC televised college football game this issue of raising the athletes scholarship and financial aid monies was being discussed.

## Soccer streak up to eight

The UNLV soccer team ran its winning streak to eight games this past weekend by defeating the San Jose State Spartans 1-0 on Friday, and then pounding the Fresno State Bulldogs 5-1 on Sunday.

The Rebels were a very frustrated team on Friday night as they set a school record for shots with 29, but only managed to score one goal.

Doug Borgel, who scored the game winning goal at 88:25, wasn't even taking a shot. "The goal I scored on wasn't even a shot it was a hard crossing pass across the middle, it just curved in to the net," he said.

UNLV relieved their frustrations on Sunday with a four goal outburst in the first 20 minutes of the game and cruised to an easy win over Fresno.

Jeff Wale started the scoring parade with the first of his two goals on the day by putting in a rebound shot at the 2:00 mark. Shawn Ritchie took a pass from Wale and pumped in the second goal at 7:31. Ten minutes later the roles were reversed when Wale took a pass from Ritchie and one touched a shot in at the far post for a 3-0 lead.

Simon Keith and George McKenna combined on the final goal of the half when Keith took a header and got the goalie out of position and scored into an open net.

Cliff Odel closed out the scoring for the Rebels with an unassisted goal at the 52:29 mark. The lone Fresno goal was scored by Hermann Trophy candidate Femi Olukanni who scored off an assist from Jim Cosgrove.

That Olukanni was ineffective was a testimonial to Eddy Johansson who was starting his first game of the year and drew the tough assignment.
