member institutions which comprise the voting body. "They make the rules and hire people to enforce the rules. Since we are a dues-paying member, the NCAA is really us," he said.

Burns said that there are over 1,000 schools within the NCAA. All of the schools vote upon certain pieces of legislation. On the other hand, certain parts of the by-laws pertain to only Division I or Division II schools.

The NCAA emphasis is to get member schools to police themselves by reporting violations on their own instead of having allegations surface from anonymous sources. Schools that report their own violations tend to have lesser penalties. When violations do occur, the NCAA will consider

whether the school has attempted to "maintain institutional control over its athletic program."

Burns said that at a conference meeting last summer, there was a proposal to reduce the number of grant-in-aid scholarships. The large Division I schools with powerful athletic programs had the sufficient weight to defeat the proposal.

"There is also a tendency for the NCAA to take on a life and power of its own, separate from its member institutions," he said.

Another dramatic transition which has occurred at UNLV is an increasing emphasis on athletic academics.

The change in the eligibility requirements for entering freshmen has been very positive, Burns said.

"Freshmen now have to achieve a certain level in their high school CORE curriculum and their national test scores also to be at a certain level.

"Our faculty are now becoming more involved in getting the student athletes to progress toward a degree. I find this newly directed emphasis over the past two years to be very healthy."

Burns said that the athletic departments are also developing strong progress in all sports. It is healthy because "it makes us competitive in a whole range of sports."

"UNLV is trying to do a better job in recruiting students who are athletes as well. It is difficult to build a reputation which will attract athletes who are concerned about the quality of the institution."
