



The Dream Academy is probably remembered by their former hit, Life in a Northern Town. Their new album, though, may change that with a collection of new hits.

Their style is still mellow and many still are about love. The only change may be that the lyrics are printed in paragraph form on the inside jacket (instead of the usual verse form).

The Lesson of Love is about a man pleading for his girlfriend not to leave him. "Don't walk out, listen to me when I say we've got a whole lot of porary additions for the magic ... " Ballad in 4/4 is a mellow song about a man in love with a married girl for seven years. Then he meets a single girl, but only to make him "feel less vulnerable."
