Pistons cut Banks

Former UNLV super-shooter Freddie Banks has been cut by the Detroit Pistons.

Banks, a 6-foot-2 guard out of Valley High School and the Pistons' first pick in the June draft, never played up to the team's expectations during the exhibition season.

In six games Banks averaged 3.7 points per game, shot 40 percent from the field and committed nine turnovers.

The Las vegas native led UNLV to a 37-2 record, No. 1 national ranking, and a berth in the NCAA Final Four last season.
