

# Harp

Harp said he noticed that while the student body is double the size of UNLV, students at Kansas University were much younger and many of them did not work. On the other hand, UNLV is a commuter school, and students attend classes during the morning. Con-

sequently, the campus becomes deserted by early afternoon.

"However," he said, "these are only superficial differences. In terms of actual student performance in the classroom, one could not say that UNLV students are any better or worse than students at

Kansas University."

On the other hand, Frey's first impression of American University was that 20 percent of the campus is composed of international students and that the major fields of study are in the areas of economics and international affairs.

Frey also said that American University offers a Ph. D. which will shortly be offered at UNLV. He found this to be beneficial because "it allowed me to work with doctorate students who were doing research projects."

Harp noted that his participation in the National

Faculty Exchange program made him aware that "there is a great amount of potential at UNLV and much of that potential has been realized. We need to keep in mind that our younger faculty is beginning to mature as teachers and scholars, and that our smaller classrooms and close student contact is to our advantage.

"When I told people at Kansas University that my department had received a \$100,000 grant this past summer from the National Endowment of the Humanities for a seminar, they were impressed. So, in spite of the bad raps which we are getting, we are beginning to achieve the national recognition which we deserve."

Frey said that the National Faculty Exchange

program has made him realize that UNLV "is a legitimate school with standards which are oftentimes higher than those of other schools. The program has also made me aware that our faculty is productive and contributing members of the academic and university community."

Harp noted that the program has helped him to evaluate courses which are being taught in the UNLV English Department. He said, "We have recently begun to teach a 104 World Literature course which has been taught at Kansas University for the past 15 years. As a National Faculty Exchange professor, I wanted to see what UNLV could do to improve our course."
