

## Sunday dance series

The UNLV Department of Dance Arts continues its series of Sunday Afternoon in the Studio performances with Deborah Stone & Friends on Sunday, February 28 at 2 p.m. in the dance studio of the McDermott Physical Education Complex on the UNLV campus.

Ms. Stone is on the dance faculty at the University teaching a full schedule of theory and modern technique classes. Over the last few years, she has established herself as a very talented choreographer constantly creating a richness of original movements with a very personalized style. In this concert, she will present other artist's works as well as her own.

Ellen Bromberg's *Toonings* will have its Las Vegas premiere with the vocal theatrics of Bobby McFerrin. Stone will perform a solo staged for her

by Victoria Panella, *Promenade*. L. Martina Young's solo *Sally in the Garden* will also be presented.

The "Friends" joining her in this concert are Debbie Ashenfelter and John Vanderploeg in *Chamber*, a new intimate duet choreographed by Stone. Also on the program is a piece with Stone and Meschell Nattin using 3 selections from the musical *Les Miserables*. It highlights vocal artist Miriam Tardibuono in a live performance. Musician Roy Sanger will also be featured in a combined spontaneous improvisation with the dancers. Sanger, who is Stone's husband, will also provide entertainment before the performance.

This is the fourth in a series of six performances. Admission to the series is \$15 which includes the February 28 concert and two more con-

certs scheduled for March and April. Individual performance tickets are also available. Tickets can be purchased in advance in the Department of Dance Arts office, located on the first floor of the UNLV Alta Ham Fine Arts Building, or at the door.



## Superman turns 50

**SUPERMAN'S 50th ANNIVERSARY: A CELEBRATION OF THE MAN OF STEEL** will be broadcast Monday, Feb. 29 (8:00-9:00 PM, PT) on the CBS Television Network. Among the special guests appearing on the special will be Kirk Alyn, who launched the role of Superman in film serials of the late 1940s, and *The Adventures of Superman* television series' star Noel Neill, who portrayed reporter Lois Lane, and Jack Larson, who was cub photographer Jimmy Olsen - both colleagues of Superman's alter ego Clark Kent at the Daily Planet newspaper.

The special visits Metropolis, Superman's hometown, and talks to its citizens about their world-renowned neighbor in a series of vignettes - some comic and affectionately satirical, others straight and nostalgic. This year-long celebration is wide-ranging, however, with special tributes and media attention being given to Superman all across the country. It seems appropriate to mark the coming anniversary with a trivia quiz for the superhero's fans, friends and neighbors alike.
