

Rebel banquet honors football standouts

The Triple Crown ballroom at the Union Plaza Hotel was the site of the UNLV Rebel Football banquet where about 350 people came out for the 4½-hour affair.

Recruiting director Steve Kadoich who coordinated the affair was the Master of Ceremonies. Awards were presented by UNLV President Robert Maxson, Athletic Director Brad Rothermel, and second-year Head Coach Wayne Nunnely.

Among the honorees were Ickey Woods, the National Collegiate Athletic Association rushing leader last season and Ike Freeman were named the offensive and defensive player of the year.

The William Morris most inspirational award went to linebacker George Varon.

Absent from the event were sophomore tightend Cedric Davis, and senior offensive lineman Tom Sweeney, Rick Gerard

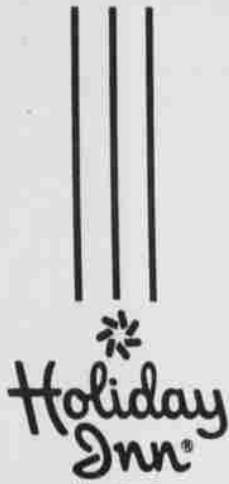
and Boby Orr.
