UNLV is offering a summer program is San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, June 27-July 22. Sponsored by UNLV's Office of International Programs and the Summer Sessions Office, the program offers classes in Spanish and marketing as well as folk singing and dancing and Spanish current events.

The program cost is \$884 for classes, room and board; transportation fees are not included. Participants can choose from first-, second- or third-year Spanish courses, which are scheduled Monday through Friday, 8:30am-12:30pm. The classes are taught by instructors from the Academia Hispano Americana, and enrollment is limited to 12 students per instructor.

The deadline to submit applications and a \$100 deposit is April 8. A final
