The motor city madman has returned. On his latest LP, Ted welcomes back his old producer Tom Wer- man (with such LP's as "Cat Scratch Fever" and "Double Live Gonzo" to his credit), and this reunion has brought out the bluesy, hard-driving Ted of old. Well, maybe not the total essence of Mr. Nugent has been reclaim- ed, but it is pretty close. One thing that seems dif- ferent is his overall vocal style. The vocal tracks on

this album seem much more subdued than the screaming, crazed jungle- man that has pleased over two decades of rock fans. The music, though, is still there. The guitar tracks (of course) are tight and full of an aggressive style that has been Ted's trademark since he played with the Amboy Dukes in the late 60's/early 70's.

The tracks on this LP have very fun connota- tions, and equally colorful titles: *Funlover*, *If You Can't Lick 'Em...Lick 'Em*, *Separate the Men From the Boys*, *Please*, and *The Harder They Come (the Harder I Get)*. If you like true American rock and roll, you'll want to look in- to this one.

and Wire Train, the Close Lobsters should prove to be a group with the possibility of a good future.
