ing seemed well accepted by fraternity members across campus...in all of this I can find no evidence that the student leadership of the Greek community took any measures to move the programs toward the fraternity ideal" of brotherhood, the dean added.

Opening the meeting, the IFC President termed the letter "somewhat exaggerated." Nevertheless, he expressed his intention to arrive at the means of stemming the problems. Chesley also condemned the notion of revenge, while saying he had heard no substantive reports of that being entertained by the Sigma Nu chapter.

"We're not in for revenge," Sigma Nu President Craig Ewing responded. At the same time, he reported that one of his actives had the night before been attacked off-campus, suffering a broken jaw. The fraternity is not prepared to say what motivated the

assault, or what was the precise nature of the encounter.

The group decided to write a Greek Week policy to replace the existing one, in hopes of making clear their rejection of violence during competitions, beginning April 16. The announced policy had been to expel a chapter from the games upon the third house infraction. What more stringent measures might pertain as a result of the meeting was not known at press time. All frats are required to sign.

Kappa Sigma President Chris Cline said he had informed his brothers that any aggression initiated on their part would result in suspension of the offending members from the rest of Greek Week.

Chesley appealed to the chapter leaders for unity of purpose, indicating that unchecked violence threatens the whole structure of Greek life at UNLV. He spoke in the context of

a concern that the university might lose interest in continued sponsorship of Greek life in campus.

Dean Ackerman declined to comment until the representatives had exhausted their discussion. When he finally spoke, he built on the pressure imposed by his earlier letter.

"The emotion I have heard most about is revenge," he said, echoing a major concern expressed in his writing. Ackerman then condemned that motive as beneath the dignity of interfraternity relations.

He also rejected the suggestion that his assessment of the fighting was at all exaggerated.

The dean was emphatic about the dire necessity of treating the status quo as a crisis. He did not limit his concern to just two houses, seeing an emergency affecting the entire Greek system at UNLV.

"The system will not survive unless all of us survive," he said, adding that he did not expect the IFC "to walk out of here singing *We Shall Overcome*, but, on the other hand, this crisis management stuff has got to stop."

Regarding the ominous talk of a withdrawal of Administration approval for Greeks on campus, Ackerman said, "The window of opportunity is closing."

According to Director of Student Life Anita Stockbauer, the IFC and Panhellenic Council are nearing completion of a Relationship Statement, comprising principles for the governance of the Greek-UNLV relationship itself.

Approval and signing of this statement must take place before the first games begin. IFC and administrators Ackerman and Stockbauer are expected to accept the finished statement by today.
