The best statement is actually the re-processing of the by-products."

The uses for the reprocessed waste Teller cited food preservation and industrial processes; reprocessing, he feels, will make the by-product less radioactive.

"Reworking, making it [the reprocessed waste] completely safe," he said. "We have had 40 years of no real danger from nuclear energy because it is; one, easily detectable and two, we have a good warning system.

The last two topics covered included the Strategic Defense Initiative [SDI] and scientific spinoffs of nuclear testing. Preferring 'response' to 'initiative' since, "the Soviets are 20 years ahead of the U.S. in research."

Teller would like to see "technology used for defense." Teller proposed, "a common defense for everyone," following the efforts of England, France, Japan, Israel and Italy — "Defend everybody thereby discourage war everywhere," he said. "We need representatives who know about these

subjects and spread that knowledge."

"Information from the test site is too secret," said Teller, "there should be more information on weapons and scientific applications."

The applications include the absorption of neutrons by nuclei creating new heavy metals; use of high pressures to compress iron two to ten fold; use of an x-ray laser to see atoms since electron microscopy requires one wavelength of light for observation within living tissue; use of positrons in creating super-conductors.

Teller was allowed to answer only a few questions due to his frail condition.

He said he felt the instruction of Physics, especially in high school, was in desperate straits.

He said he feels teachers should act as coaches, teaching students to teach themselves.

"The best teacher is one who loves the subject therefore managing to get students interested."
