Early Studies

UNLV's Center for Economic Education and the Early Studies Program are offering a special summer course titled "Current

Economic Issues" for qualified high school students who want to earn three university credits.

The course will be taught in a special format, meeting Monday through Friday, Aug. 1-19 (15 class days), from 8am to noon.

There will be room for a maximum of 24 students in the class. It is open to high school students who are eligible for the university's Early Studies Program (3.0 grade point average for 1989 graduates, 3.5 GPA for 1990 graduates).

Students are being recruited through the Early Studies Program, with the cooperation of the Clark County School District Partnership Office and high school counselors.

Intended for all students, regardless of their future college majors, the course will be a "pre-principles-level" introduction to economics.

Students will learn about the American economy; how markets work; the economics of higher education, energy, and crime and its prevention; corporations and securities markets; money and our monetary system; entrepreneurship; the economics of gaming and the Nevada economy; and international economic issues.

Library News

It was announced today that the James R. Dickinson Library will be increasing the basic fine rate from 10 cents to 20 cents per item, per day. According to Kay Tuma, Head of the Circulation Section, inflation caused the decision to raise the fines. "We have maintained the 10 cent rate for over ten years," she stated, "while costs for materials, wages and postage have steadily in-

creased. We held out longer than most area libraries but now find we must increase the rates."

Dean Covington, Head of the Library's Public Services Division, announced a rare 'Fine Forgiveness Day' in conjunction with the establishment of the new fine rate. "I am pleased to announce that Friday, May 6 will be the Library's Official Forgiveness Day," Covington said. "Overdue books returned on that day will have all fines waived." He also cautioned that only UNLV books returned on May 6 will be subject to the fine waiver, and that fees would still be charged for lost or damaged books.

The fine increase will become effective on Saturday, May 7, 1988.
