It was announced today that the James R. Dickinson Library will be increasing the basic fine rate from 10 cents to 20 cents per item, per day. According to Kay Tuma, Head of the Circulation Section, inflation caused the decision to raise the fines. "We have maintained the 10 cent rate for over ten years," for materials, wages and

He also cautioned that only UNLV books returned on May 6 will be subject to the fine waiver, and that fees would still be charged for lost or damaged books.

The fine increase will become effective on Saturday, May 7, 1988.
