Safari

UNLV's alumni Relations Office is organizing an African Safari to Kenya's finest game parks June 17-July 2, 1989.

Former UNLV president and ornithologist Dr. Donald Baeppler will accompany the tour. Baeppler has over 30 years of experience in tropical ecology, and he has traveled extensively in the tropics of South America, Central America, and North Africa.

The safari will begin in Nairobi, Kenya's thriving capital where sightseeing includes a visit to Karen Blixen's home from "Out of Africa" and the Nairobi National Park.

Special activities, such as hot air balloon ride over the Savannah at sunrise, will be offered when the tour spends two days in Kenya's most famous reserve, the Maasai Mara.

The package includes most meals and an escorted tour. The cost is \$3,590 per person for double occupancy, and \$3,990 per person for single occupancy. The deadline to register is March 17, 1989.

The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) has awarded a two-year contract to American Indian Scholarships, Inc. (AIS) of Albuquerque, New Mexico for the continued administration of its fellowship program for American Indian graduate students.

To be considered for a fellowship grant under this program, an applicant must be: (1) an enrolled member of a federally-recognized Indian tribe or Alaska Native group; (2) attending an accredited graduate school in the United States as a full-time graduate student; (3) pursuing either a master's or doctorate degree; and, (4) an on-time applicant for financial aid at the college financial aid office. Grant

UNLV's James R. Dickinson Library has received a \$100,000 grant from the Los Angeles-based W.M. Keck Foundation.

The gift will be used to convert the library's remaining card catalog records into a more modern and accessible computerized system. The library has already installed the computer terminals for the new

online public-access catalog, TOMUS, which patrons may use to find library materials.

UNLV will match the \$100,000 gift with funds that were appropriated for the library automation project by the 1987 Nevada Legislature.
