# Rebel Soccer wins one, loses one on the road

The UNLV Rebel soccer team came up against two tough opponents on the road last weekend.

Friday, Oct. 6th, the Rebels battled UC Santa Barbara at Harder Stadium, and on Sunday afternoon the Rebels came head-to-head with UC Irvine on Crawford field.

The Rebels suffered a 2-1 overtime loss against Santa Barbara, dropping their record to 6-6 overall and 1-2 in conference play.

The Gauchos came into Friday's game with a 3-4-1 record over-all. The Gauchos are coached by 1988 Big West Coach of the Year, Andy Kuenzli.

UNLV led the all-time series

between the two schools by a 7-6-4 count before Fridays game.

The Gauchos tallied its first win over the Rebels in the last nine matches with a 3-0 win last year at Harder Stadium.

This was the second consecutive weekend that the Rebels split a pair of conference games.

Friday night marked the Rebels' first overtime match of the season.

UCSB's Will Gould put the Gauchos on the scoreboard first at the 27 minute mark. But UNLV quickly answered back as UNLV's Doug Borgel evened the match up off a cross from Daniel Barber.

It also marked Borgel's ninth goal of the season.

But the Gauchose won it in

overtime as the Gauchos James Strange pounded the rebound from a deflected shot by UNLV goalie Todd Neel into the back of the net in the 103 minute.

The Rebels have struggled to a 1-4-3 mark in overtime games over the last two seasons.

Sunday afternoon the Rebels conquered UC Irvine 2-1. Sundays win improved UNLV's record to 7-6 over-all and 2-2 in the Big West Conference.

The UC Irvine Anteaters came into Sundays' match 3-6-1.

UNLV leads the all-time series 8-0 against UC Irvine after Sundays game.

The Anteaters attack was headed up by Kevin Smith with a season total of four goals and one

assist and John Gunderson with four goals.

Sundays match might have been called the Jeff Wade scoring hour. Junior midfielder Jeff Wade opened up the scoring at the four minute mark on a penalty kick awarded to the Rebels after an Anteater defender tackled Rebel Daniel Barber in the penalty box.

The Anteaters tied the match up at the 28 minute mark on a goal by John Gunderson.

But it was Wade again who scored the winning goal at the 49 minute mark. Wade scored his second goal of the match on a 10 yard diagonal after receiving a long ball from Cliff Odle.

UNLV has now run its record to 4-0 in day games this season.

UNLV is also 7-0 in Sunday afternoon conference games over the past two seasons.

UNLV junior midfielder Doug Borgel continued to lead the Big West Conference in scoring with nine goals and 23 points.

UNLV also has two new additions to the Top Tens. Midfielder Jeff Wade and forward Doug Borgel have moved among UNLV career scoring leaders. Wade has tallied 54 career points (22 goals and 10 assists) which places him seventh on the career list.

Borgel has a total of 46 points (16 goals and 14 assists) placing him ninth on the list.

Both players still have almost one and one-half seasons remaining in both of their careers.

## Darin Brightmon named 'Player of the Week'

Darin Brightmon was named Big West "Player of the Week" for his performance in UNLV's homecoming game against Pacific last weekend. Brightmon rushed for 211 yards and two touchdowns in 22 carries.

He has surpassed his 1988 total yards of 565 with a total of 580 so far this season. Brightmon has been very successful the last two weeks at home carrying the ball 33 times for 394 yards.

Fellow running back Kyle Toomer added 84 yards to UNLV's

total 383 rushing yards against Pacific. Quarterback Derek Stott and Marvin Eastman each scored touchdowns in the 30-7 victory over Pacific. Kicker Todd Amrein made a perfect debut for UNLV with a 39 yard field goal and completed on two extra point conversions.

UNLV's defense was tough allowing Pacific only 49 rushing yards and 207 total yards.

The Rebels get their second bye of the season this weekend but will travel to DeKalb, Illinois to face Northern Illinois on October 21.
