More organizations involved in sales

More and more organizations are involved in student union sales this semester, Theresa Chiang, director of the Donald C. Moyer Student Union said.

"This semester we have seen a whole lot more poster sales because we have more residents on campus and they want something to decorate their room with but at the same time they don't want to go to a local gallery and pay 200 dollars for a poster," she said.

"This is on a first come first serve basis and only recognized

student organizations or a company sponsored by one of the colleges, departments or agencies can hold sales inside the Moyer Student Union," Chiang said.

The type of sales that occur in the MSU are bake sales, poster sales or gift-item sales. They are used as a fundraising effort for student organizations such as sororities, who sponsor the National Poster Company to get a certain percentage of their profits. The university does not charge the company anything for allocating the space, except \$2 for the paperwork involved.

"The companies must have

valid Nevada business licenses, and we want to make sure all these merchants coming into this building are legitimate, not fly-by-night operations; this is not a flea market," Chiang said.

"This money can be put towards leadership training and field trips," Chiang said. "I think indirectly or directly this has something to do with the betterment of the organization.

"Sure, people can argue on the sales taking up too much room or distracting peoples attention. But overall these union sales are tightly regulated, not just any commercial establishment can sell in the union."

Bourque said, "We're not trying to punish the occasional user. We're trying to prevent the abuser. We want to do a better job for fans so they can enjoy the game."

Bourque said the paramount problem with alcohol is the enforcement of the tailgate parties. Bourque said he also questions what the half-time exit policy is.

Pat Christenson, assistant director to the T and M and Silver Bowl said all his vendors selling alcohol have to pass a four hour certification program recognizing

the problems with alcohol. To complement the vendors awareness of alcohol abuse, all personnel will soon be trained in a TEAM project. TEAM stands for Technics in Effective Alcohol Management.

Christenson said the pilot program will begin in November at the Thomas and Mack, and the goal for the Silver Bowl is next year.

The comprehensive team approach will include parking attendants, ticket takers, ushers, and box-office personnel on the lookout for alcohol abuse.

to build an overpass for dorm residents, much like the structure at the University of Nevada, Reno. Unfortunately, Hollenbeck said, UNLV lacks the funds and necessary space to support such an overpass, and officials consider closing the two most hazardous roads the obvious solution.

The closure is only part of several parking proposals under consideration, Hollenbeck said. Parking fees are being proposed to finance a two-tier covered and lit parking structure, a facility UNLV foresees necessary in the near future.

In the short run, a two-step parking plan is being considered, Hollenbeck said, where fees are paid for premium parking lots (such as Lot E in front of the Moyer Student Union) in order to build more parking space, and an eventual fee for all students so parking becomes self-sufficient and funds can be diverted to other university needs. The two-step plan is in the early stages, as enforcement for premium parking areas needs to be decided.

A card-access system has been suggested, as well as using a portion of the parking fees to defend the premium lots, Hollenbeck said.


