Hotel professor dies

Charles Levinson, a professor of hotel administration and chairman of the Department of Food and Beverage, died October 20 in a local hospital. He was 56.

Levinson had been a member of the William Harrah College of Hotel Administration since 1970. He was appointed chairman of the Food and Beverage Department earlier this year.

He was a well-known and highly respected instructor. He had wrote such books as "Food and Beverage Operations: Cost Control Systems and Management," and also organized and led tours to the Soviet Union and China.

Levinson was born in New York City on July 13, 1933. He came to Las Vegas in 1970.

He earned both his undergraduate and graduate degrees from the Cornell College of Hotel

Administration. He went on to become on executive chef and purchasing director for the Stamford House Hotel in Stamford, Conn., in 1957.

Before coming to UNLV, Levinson was the manager of the Cooperstown Country Club in Cooperstown, N.Y.

Levinson is survived by his wife, Irma Bernice of Las Vegas; daughters Ann Jaffe, Leah Levinson and Rebecca Levinson, all of San Diego; one sister, Jan Trachtenberg, one grandson, Brett Jaffe, and many other relatives.

Services were held on Oct. 23 at the Palm Valley View Mortuary on South Eastern Avenue.

Bunin said the meeting was held to answer questions the candidates had concerning the rules, and the board went over the rules and interpreted every single one written down.

After the board had answered the candidates' questions, they decided to give everyone a 24-hour "grace period" to correct any problems with posters, Bunin said. After the grace period, board members found only two violations, pertaining to posters for B and E Senator Bud Benneman, who was on Swank's ticket.

The posters in question, Bunin said, were covering the posters of other candidates.

"One of the rules, that James Swank specifically violated often, we didn't have interpret," Bunin said. "It was clear. I [the board

policy] says that no poster shall cover other posters of candidates. If you do, it is a one dollar fine per poster."

He said that Swank and his ticket violated the rule 17 times and were fined accordingly plus an extra two dollars for Benneman having his name on one bulletin board three times, which was a violation of the rules.

Swank said that he read the rule to mean that each candidate could have one poster and that each ticket could have one poster.

Both Swank and Benneman filed motions into the Judicial Council against the Elections Board, claiming biased actions were taken by the board against them, said Dan Wall, chief justice of the council.

Wall said that Swank dropped his case after the election and Ben-

neman continued on with his case, but he did not have any evidence to support his claim and his case was not heard.

"If there was any real evidence of indiscretion on behalf of the Elections Board, the Judicial Council would have taken action," Wall said. "But there was no proof of bias."

Swank said he dropped his case after he discovered that Bunin did not excuse himself from the council, since the case involved him.

"All the hassle is, in my opinion, that two guys were pretty upset because they got fined so much," Bunin said. "But it was their own mistake for not following the rules."

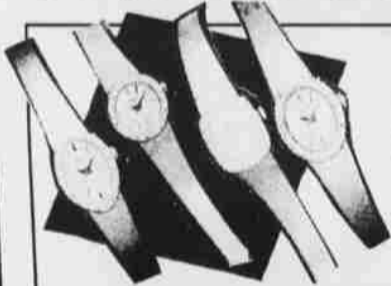
Bunin said that Swank should have asked questions about the poster rules before.

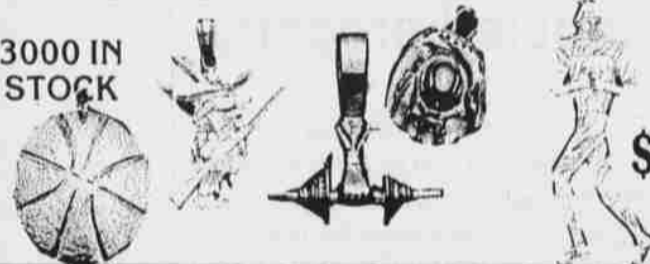

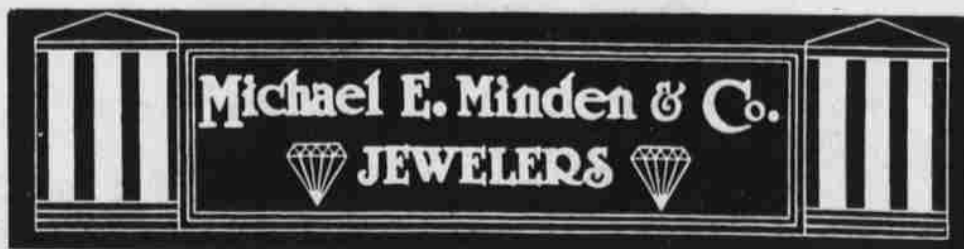
