### Philosophy lecture set

UNLV philosophy instructor Francis J. Beckwith will discuss "Sound Bites and Unsound Reasoning: Critical Thinking and Popular Moral Rhetoric," on Oct. 30 at 7:30 p.m. in Room 241 of the Frank and Estella Beam Hall.

The lecture, free and open to the public, is part of the University Forum Series.

According to Beckwith, moral debate is commonplace in society.

"Unfortunately, many popular spokespersons and organizations who defend particular moral positions have resorted to rhetoric which, upon critical examination, has little logical merit," he said.

In his lecture, Beckwith will

critically analyze three major areas of debate, using examples from such current controversies as abortion, animal rights and teaching creationism in public schools.

Beckwith earned a doctorate and master's degree in apologetics from Simon Greenleaf School of Law and a bachelor's degree from UNLV.

The author of several scholarly articles and reviews, Beckwith has written two books, "Baha'i" and "David Hume's Argument Against Miracles: A Critical Analysis."
