

Professors deny charges

checking account." Neal also said that Vergiels' record shows Vergiels did not work to push for the betterment of the public on a single piece of legislation. Neal added that he has pushed for libraries and fire codes for the hotels.

Professor Martha Young, former Chairwoman of Secondary Education, said she never had any complaints concerning Vergiels. "He has reached out to help others," she said.

Young said that Vergiels, being a professor in social education and a social scientist, "has a real appreciation for culture differences and recognizes cultural differences as positive, not negative."

Professor Jerry Simich, chairman of Political science, said he never received any complaints about Titus.

"Dina is not a racist," said Simich. "She is even-handed and fair. I understand Neal is mad and hurt but I can't understand why he accused Dina."

Robert Louis Arrington Jr., president of the Black Students Association, agrees with Simich. "Personally I don't think she [Titus] is a racist," he said. "The BSA thinks Titus is an excellent professor."

Arrington said the BSA has not heard anything negative about either professor.

Concerning racism at the uni-

versity overall, Arrington said he looks at the university as a microcosm of the real world.

Arrington said he has not seen any overt racism, but recalled one incident with a member.

"One member wrote a report and the professor questioned him as to who tutored him. When he said that a tutor didn't write the report, the professor double-checked with the tutors."

"I feel blacks at the university are expected to do average work, which is better than a couple years ago when they were expected to fail," he said.

Arrington said he feels the university generally is a good school and is progressive.

UNLV would like to do is to establish a clearinghouse of information where students could come to find out what voluntary programs are available and how they can become involved on campus.

He said it would also be designed to promote what is already being done by students in voluntary work and to encourage the departments to come up with something if they feel it would be important to their curriculum.

"We want to encourage and enhance further volunteerism through this central clearinghouse," he said.

Rogich reminded that all the

subjects would have to be approved by faculty. He said he believes the proposal would be healthy for the university and exciting for the students.

"It will be up for discussion in the December meeting and I feel it has been received well by the students and the faculty," he said.

Bunin said he and the senate did talk to a number of students on campus and found that the majority of them did not like the idea of a required class for credit in volunteerism.

They do like doing voluntary work but they feel it should not be mandatory, he said.
