Former casino exec to speak

The former chairman of the New Jersey casino Control Commission is set to be the inaugural speaker in UNLV's Mead Dixon Lecture Series. Walter N. Read's address is set for Feb. 23, 7 pm., in the Boyd Dining Room of Frank and Estella Beam Hall. A reception for Read starts at 6 pm. in the dining room.

Read was sworn in for his fourth term as chairman of the New Jersey Casino Control Commission in December 1982. He was appointed to a second term in 1987 and retired from the post in January 1990.

A member of the casino Reinvestment Development Authority and the Governor's Advisory Commission on Gambling, he has served

as president of the New Jersey State Bar Association and the Camden County Bar Association.

Prior to joining the control commission, Read was a partner in the law firm of Archer, Breiner, and Read, P.C. of Haddonfield.

The Mead Dixon Lecture Series was founded to promote education in the gaming and entertainment fields. It is co-sponsored by the law firms Rudin and Appel of Beverly Hills, Calif., and Vargas and Bartlett of Las Vegas and Reno.

The series is named for a man who has been instrumental in the development of gaming law.

Known for his significant role in the passage of legislation which helped establish corporate gaming in Nevada, Dixon's expertise also

led to legislation that enabled Nevada gaming operators to engage in gaming outside the state—notably in New Jersey.

As chairman of Harrah's, Dixon was instrumental in the expansion of Harrah's properties and in establishing Harrah's move to Atlantic City. Later, he negotiated the merger between Harrah's and Holiday Inns.

Dixon is recognized as an international expert on gaming law and regulation. He has traveled extensively to Australia to assess the feasibility of casino legislation there.
