Dr. Michael Scriven lectures in Beam Hall April 26

The "Philosophical Foundation of Las Vegas" will be the topic of discussion during the next University Forum Series presentation on April 26, 7:30 p.m., in the UNLV's Frank and Estella Beam Hall, Room 241.

Dr. Michael Scriven, professor of psychology and director of the Evaluation Institute at the Pacific Graduate School of Psychology in California, will discuss the ethical status of several actual and alleged Las Vegas activities, including gambling, prostitution, education, and corruption.

On April 25, Scriven will lecture on "The Logic of Evaluating Products and Personnel" at 3 p.m. in Beam Hall, Room 242. This lecture is part of the Converging Interests in Contemporary Rhetoric Lecture Series, and it is co-sponsored by the Nevada Humanities Committee and UNLV's department of communication studies, English and

philosophy. Both lectures are free and open to the public.

Scriven earned his doctorate degree in philosophy from Oxford University in 1956, and he has taught philosophy at several universities, including University of Minnesota, Indiana University, University of California-Berkeley, and, most recently, University of Western Australia.

A prolific writer, Scriven is the author of more than 250 scholarly publications and several books, including "Applied Logic: An Introduction to Scientific Method," "Primary Philosophy," and "The Theory and Practice of Evaluation."

The University Forum Series is sponsored each semester by UNLV's College of Liberal Arts. Scriven's forum lecture is also co-sponsored by Dr. Howard Hoffman and by El Paso Natural Gas and Burlington Resources, Inc.
