

Lady Rebel Tennis sweeps final homestand

UNLV Lady Rebel tennis won all three matches in their final homestand last weekend with victories over Fresno State, 7-2, Long Beach State, 8-1 and Hawaii, 5-4.

UNLV defeated the Bulldogs of Fresno State and Long Beach State on Saturday, April 14. The Lady Rebels dominated the Lady Bulldogs by winning four of the six singles matches and all three doubles matches. All-America candidate Jolene Watanabe added to her school record victory mark with her 27th victory of the season to give her a total of 116. Senior Debbie Higa also came out of a five-match losing streak to capture the number three singles match 6-

3, 6-1. UNLV head coach Craig Witcher rested his top players in the afternoon match against Long Beach State but still came away with a solid victory.

Higa led the team with a 6-1, 6-0 victory while Madeleine Jonsson ended her six-match losing streak with a 6-3, 6-1 win in the number two singles match.

The Lady Rebels posted a final home match win over the Rainbow Wahines on April 16. Senior Diana Chavez won her 29th singles victory of the season with a 6-2, 6-3 win in the number one singles match and fellow senior Mary Jacocks is now just one victory shy of her sec-

ond consecutive 20-win season with a 6-4, 6-2 win in the number five singles match.

With the victories over the weekend, UNLV is just two wins shy of their record for most wins in a season. Their current record stands at 5-3 in the Big West Conference and 22-13 overall which is the second time UNLV has hit the 20-win mark since Witcher took over the head coaching position.

Pepperdine is next up for UNLV for the regular season finisher on April 24, before the Big West Championships in Ojai, California, April 26 through April 29.

UNLV football player Derek Stott is out indefinitely after a neck injury in spring practice earlier this week.
