

Lady Rebel Basketball signs four players

The results proved conclusive as four recruits officially signed national letters of intent with the Lady Rebel's basketball program. Junior college All-Americans Debra Davis and Sharon Hargrove, along with high school standouts Mildred Conston and Gloria Eldridge, will join coach Jim Bolla's successful team next year.

Davis is a 6-2 forward, who lead College of the Sequoias (Visalia, CA) squad to the championship game of the California state tourna-

ment.

The Oakland, CA native averaged 21 points, 13 rebounds and five blocked shots a game. She was equally tough in high school during the 1988 season. She led Fremont High School (Oakland, CA) to the California state 5-A championship. She will pursue a degree in criminal justice.

Hargrove is a Kodak junior college first team All-America from Central Arizona College (Coolidge, AZ). The 5-10 guard led Central to a third place finish nationally by averaging 22 points a game. She also was an All-American in 1989.

She went to Compton High School (Compton, CA) the same school Lady Rebel Many Hannah attended and, will pursue a degree in criminal justice.

Conston is the second high school recruit from the San Diego area to sign with the Lady Rebels this year. Tyeast Brown from Point Loma, signed during the early signing period in November. Conston, of Oceanside High (California), averaged 19 points, 14.9 rebounds, six blocked shots and five assists in her senior season.

She was named the most valu-

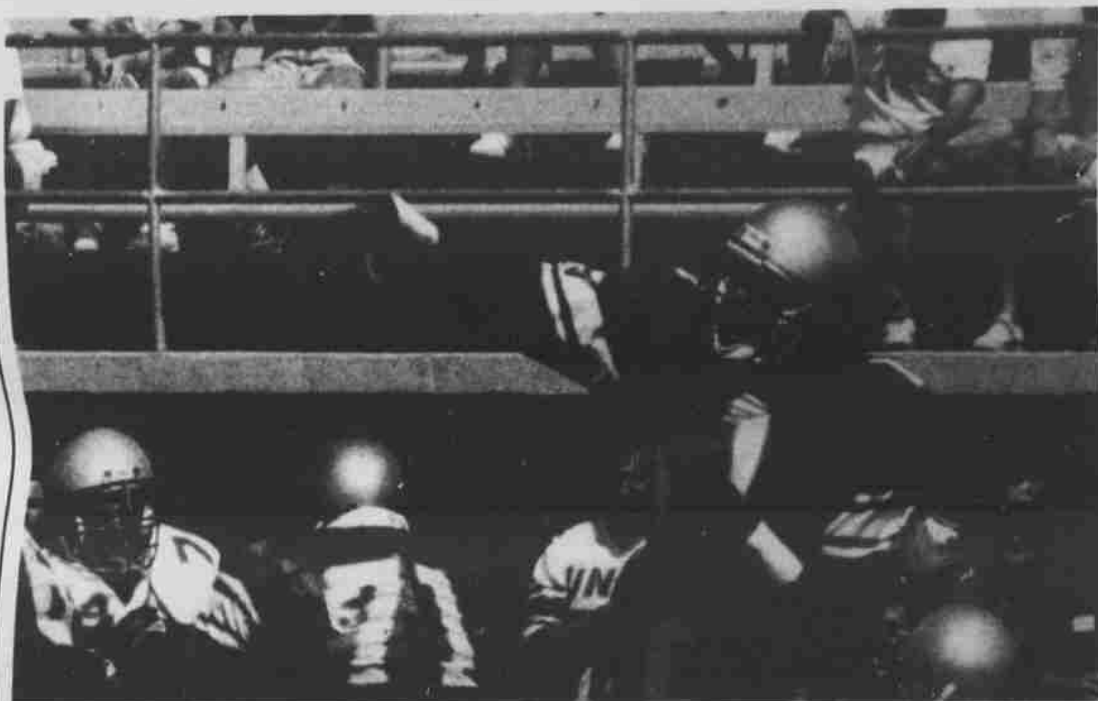
able player in her league and brings some much-needed size down low for the Lady Rebels. She was a member of the all-state team and selected to the all-CIF squad in the San Diego area as well. Conston will be a true freshman and will seek a degree in communications.

The fourth recruit to commit to the Lady Rebels is the team's first high school point guard in four seasons. Eldridge, named Wisconsin's player of the year by USA Today, is a multisport athlete and an academic standout at West High in Madison.

The 5-9 point guard averaged 25 points, nine rebounds, five assists and five steals a game. She was named first team all-state by the Associated Press. Her high school captured the regional championship in her sophomore and junior seasons. She is a true freshman and will major in communications.

"We've had a very good recruiting year," UNLV Lady Rebel Coach Jim Bolla said. "With the players we have returning and the addition of these recruits, we should once again be a preseason top 10 team."

Rebel Golfers place fourth in Sun Devil Invitational

Although host Arizona State took their own tournament by 25 strokes at the Sun Devil Classic, the UNLV Rebel Golfer's were fourth after the final results were posted and played very well considering blistering heats and slick greens due to the Arizona weather.

UNLV's top player Hugh Goyen shot 70-74-70 for a total of 214 as Goyen placed ourth individuals for best gross score as well as the Rebels placing fourth in the tournament. The 13th ranked Rebel Golfers got help from Monte

Montgomery who shot at 75-73-72 for a total of 220, Warren Schutte 76-74-72-220, Darin Osborn 75-74-72-221, and Brandon Goethals 72-79-74-225.

Goyen is from Scottsdale, Arizona and he and the Rebel golfers were second to Oklahoma State in the final round 281-284 which is four under par. The final AP Poll for this week has UNLV at 13th and Arizona State (2nd), Oklahoma (1st), and Arizona at (5th).

The Rebels will play at BYU this weekend and then on to Logan, Utah for the Big West Conference Championship April 30-May 1.
