### What is CSUN?

Contrary to frequent misconception, CSUN does not stand for California State University at Northridge. At this institution CSUN is the acronym for the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada at Las Vegas and functions as a self-governing, independent entity of UNLV. It is commonly known as the Student Government.

### Who is a member of CSUN?

All matriculated undergraduate students of UNLV, upon payment of registration

fees, shall be members of CSUN until the following semester.

### So what?! CSUN! Student Government! What does this mean to me?!

Paraphrasing the CSUN Constitution, all CSUN members have the right to obtain any information regarding all public and financial actions of CSUN; attend any official, open meeting of any CSUN entity; be represented to the Board of Regents through CSUN; petition CSUN; and, vote in any CSUN election.

Translated, this means that you, the student, have a voice in what happens in student government. You have several avenues that are open to you when interested in any CSUN matter.

In addition, this also means that the CSUN representatives are here to serve you - "Students Serving Students" - whether that be as a voice on the Senate, providing free scantrons and/or 'red' books, contracting entertainment for CSUN events, organizational funding, free or reduced tickets to UNLV sporting events . . . (the list goes on!)

## Free legal counsel available

CSUN Student Government provides FREE Legal Counsel through its Office of Student Services. Attorney at Law, Adrienne Cobb gives counsel regarding:
