EDUCATING WOMEN: A GREATER CATASTROPHE THAN COMMUNISM

In Peshawar Pakistan, Moslem clerics who claim to represent the Afghan guerrilla movement, have condemned education for women and warn of a "greater catastrophe than communism" unless schools for women are closed.

In a poster-sized edict, 80 Islamic clerics said "women attending schools where subjects like English, history and geography are being taught instead of Islamic texts and roles are disgraceful."

The same edict, written in Afghanistan's native Push to language, also said women must not go out without their husband's permission, must not wear perfume, must not laugh when speaking, must not speak to strangers, and must not wear clothing that rustles.

A spokesman for a self-declared guerrilla "government-inexile" said the view was not the policy of his coalition of US

UNLV grad runs for **Board of Education**

University of Nevada, Las Vegas graduate Steve Stallworth has announced his candidacy for election to the Nevada State Board of Education, Sub-District 2b.

Stallworth, 26, graduated from UNLV in 1987 with a degree in communication studies. He played quarterback for the UNLV football team from 1982-86, and received the 1986 Scholar-Athlete Award. IRS GETS THEIR INFO

The IRS uses between 750 and 900 "controlled informants" a year-people who spill information that the IRS subsequently uses to go after a delinquent taxpayer. Incredibly, an estimated 20 of those informants are tax accountants.

Unlike lawyers, accountants are not bound by confidentiality requirements with their clients. The American Institute deplores the practice, but it happens anyway.

A St. Louis man recently discovered, after he was indicted by a federal grand jury on six counts of tax evasion, that his accountant had gone to the IRS with the damning information. In return, the accountant got a break on his own tax problem.

LAKE MEAD CONSIDERS FEES

Soon, Lake Mead users may be paying to enjoy the lake.

The National Park Service has proposed charging an admission fee to the popular Lake Mead National Recreation Area starting Jan., 1992.

Visitors would pay \$5 a vehicle for a seven day pass, which would raise money for the upkeep and maintenance of the area.

Lake Mead has been a free attraction since the 1930's but officials say visitor volume is taking its toll.
