

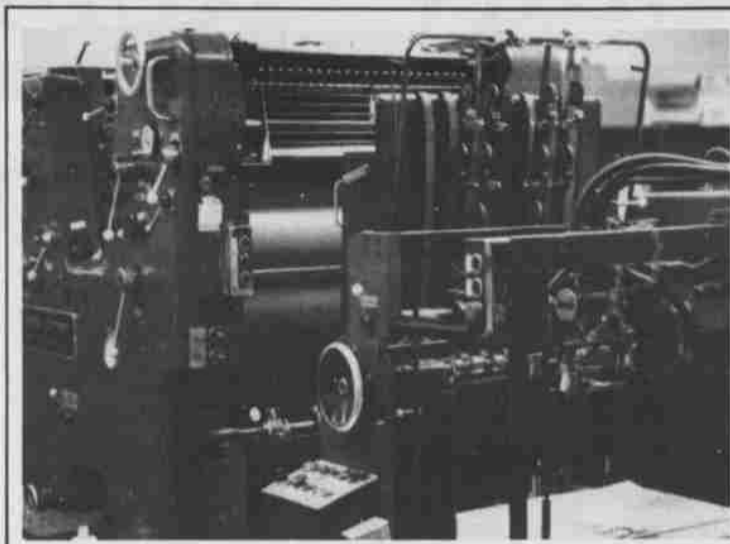
# Kurzynowski: New manager of printing center

There is something out there that much of the UNLV community has forgotten about or should begin to know about. Right behind the UNLV police department is a 7,200 square foot building containing our full scale printing center. The center prints everything from small pamphlets to professionally bound books.

The campus printing center has existed since our school started. Students and faculty alike should know that they can get a low price and fast service for their projects.

Twenty-one year veteran of the printing industry Paul Kurzynowski replaced Roger Swarts as the new manager in July. Kurzynowski, who was a pressman for his first ten years in the printing business, recently left his position with First Farwest Insurance Co. in Port-

land, Oregon, and has just moved to Las Vegas to take the management position at UNLV. Kurzynowski attended Eastern Michigan University and majored

in business management there.

Kurzynowski said of the services provided by UNLV, "We provide all services of an operation."

He is currently utilizing page makeup software and graphic software on the Macintosh computer, and he now has a full graphic camera capability which includes a darkroom.

Presently, Kurzyhowski estimates a one million impressions per month production rate (impression meaning to print an image down on a sheet), which is handled by his crew of eleven and himself.

"We're basically here for the campus community," Kurzyhowski said. "We have a few clients outside of the campus."

However, the services are focussed mainly on the students and faculty.

Kurzyhowski said that the service is very competitive as

high school or college student between the ages of 16 and 26. In addition, students who enroll automatically will be members in TWA's Frequent Flight Bonus Program and have 3,000 miles awarded to them if they fly TWA within 90 days of joining.

### UNLV center offers counseling

UNLV's Client Services Center offers low-cost counseling to community members.

Graduate students who are working on a master's degree in counseling operate the center, which helps people resolve personal conflicts, such as marital and family problems.

The center does not deal with crisis counseling such as that needed for suicide prevention or chronic emotional disorders, but staff members will refer people with these problems to other agencies. The center charges \$10 per hour, but the price is negotiable for those experiencing financial difficulties. One-hour sessions are scheduled during the afternoons, Monday through Thursday and Saturdays.
