

# Athletic facility offers a variety of programs

Many students aren't aware of the tremendous number of sports recreational facilities that University of Nevada, Las Vegas provides as part of their fees. UNLV boasts the following facilities for students use, free of charge: basketball courts, tennis courts, racquetball courts, swimming pool, free weight rooms, and life fitness machine weight rooms. All of these facilities are located in or near the Paul C. McDermott Physical Education Center.

The basketball courts are available for free play from 12-2 p.m. and 6 to 10 p.m., Monday through Friday; and 12 to 5 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. Balls can be rented for free at the equipment room at PCMPEC.

Tennis courts are available to students from 12:30 to 2 p.m., 5 to 6 p.m., and 8 to 10 p.m., Monday through Thursday. There are open courts all day and night on Friday through Sunday. Tennis racquets may be rented for \$1 at the equipment room.

The racquetball courts are open for free recreation from 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., except 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Monday and Wednesday. On Tuesday and Thursday, the courts can be had from 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m., except 8:30 a.m. to 12 p.m.

and 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.. Friday hours are 6:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Saturday hours are 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Sunday, the courts are open from 10:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Once again, racquets may be rented for \$1 at the equipment room. Reservations for a court may be made by calling 739-3150.

The Swimming pool is available from 1 to 3:30 p.m. and 8:30 to 10 p.m., Monday through Thursday. The pool is only open from 1 to 3:30 p.m. on Fridays. Feel free to take a dip from 1 to 5 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, as well. Bring your own towel.

The free weight room can be used from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m., Monday through Friday; and from 12 to 4 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. The life fitness machine weight room can be utilized Monday through Friday, from 12 to 2 p.m. and 6:30 to 9:30 p.m.

Lockers are available inside the gym by leaving a \$5 deposit. If you wish to have a very large locker, there is an additional \$10 fee. See Arturo (he's very cooperative) or whomever is staffing the equipment room at the time.

These facilities are all on campus, and thus are easy, convenient and cheap to use. No more excuses that local athletic clubs cost too much. So, work out, stay in shape, and have fun; courtesy of UNLV.

Reasons for abandoning their senatorial responsibilities temporarily were: to attend class, to make other appointments, etc. In the future, senate meeting will be able to flow more expediently and professionally, as normal, except when taking time out to excuse those senators who inappropriately scheduled classes during the normal senate meeting times - in direct conflict of meeting their senatorial responsibilities. They know who they are (and I'm sure they'll explain it to their colleges).
