# "60 Minutes" Ed Bradley to give speech at UNLV

Ed Bradley, CBS reporter and member of the "60 Minutes" reporting team, will open the Barrick Lecture Series 10th season with a speech entitled "60 Minutes with Ed Bradley."

Bradley's talk will be at 7:30 p.m. in the Artemus Ham Concert Hall at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas on Sept. 13.

In the early 1970s, Bradley was a CBS stringer in Saigon. Before that, he was a reporter in New York and also Philadelphia, his home.

Bradley then served as White House correspondent and anchorman for the "Sunday Evening News" on CBS. He next joined the "60 Minutes" crew.

The winner of numerous journalism awards, Bradley's achievements include several Emmy and Alfred DuPont - Columbia University awards.

Tickets are required but Bradley's talk is free. UNLV Performing Arts Center will have the tickets available beginning Sept. 8 at their box office.






