

UNLV soccer team defeats 7th ranked Indiana

The University of Nevada, Las Vegas Rebel soccer team won its first match of the year in a 2-0 victory over 7th ranked Indiana Sunday afternoon at Peter Johann Memorial field.

Indiana and UNLV played aggressive, physical soccer from the start of the game and both coaches were warned for yelling at the officials over disputed calls.

Rebel forward Terry Pryer broke the scoreless tie with 16 minutes, 44 seconds in the first half when he received the ball from across and shot the ball into the right corner of the net past the diving Indiana keeper.

The Rebels next opportunity came shortly after the first goal when Richie Louis took a penalty kick that bounced off the crossbar and was followed by Ben Erickson who knocked it over the goal.

UNLV continued to pressure the Hoosiers throughout the first half using smart passes and a

solid defense.

Early in the second half the Rebels scored on a corner kick when Richie Louis headed the ball into the net at the 54:56 mark to give UNLV a 2-0 lead.

The score would have been 3-0, minutes later, if the Rebels had not been called for offside after Doug Borgel made a perfect pass to teammate Terry Pryer who shot past the Hoosier goalie and scored.

UNLV did not let up, and continued to take several shots on goal, shredding the tired Indiana defense.

UNLV's shutout of Indiana marked the first time Indiana has been shut out in two consecutive games (they didn't score Saturday) in their entire school history.

In other tournament action on Saturday, the Rebels tied Old Dominion 0-0.

UNLV is now 1-0-1 on the year and will face San Diego on Friday, Sept. 7, at 7 p.m. and also on Saturday Sept. 8, at 7 p.m. at Peter Johann Memorial Field on campus.
