UNLV Fall enrollment 1990

UNLV's enrollment continues to climb as more students than ever before have signed up for classes this fall, according to President Robert C. Maxson.

Unofficial, preliminary headcount figures for Fall Semester 1990 are 17,536, an increase of 1,216 (7.5 percent) over last fall's enrollment.

While nearly 90 percent of UNLV's students are Nevadans, 22 states and 44 foreign countries

are represented in the student body.

"Our growth over the past few years has been nothing short of phenomenal, and this semester is no exception," Maxson said.

Noting that the string of large enrollment increases is straining university facilities, Maxson said, "I am confident that the continued support of our Board of Regents, the Governor, the Nevada Legislature, and our many private

donors will enable us to meet the educational demands placed on this wonderful university."

He added, "I am pleased to be able to say that while we are getting bigger, we are continuing to get better, and that is the important thing. Every year we are enrolling the best, brightest young scholars Nevada has to offer, as well as serving many talented non-traditional students."
