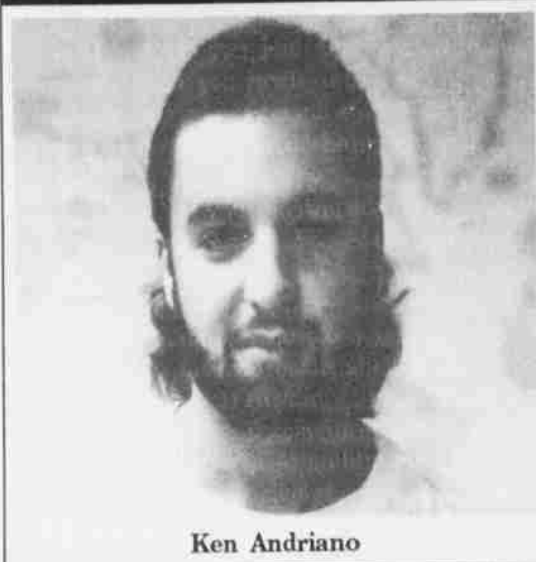

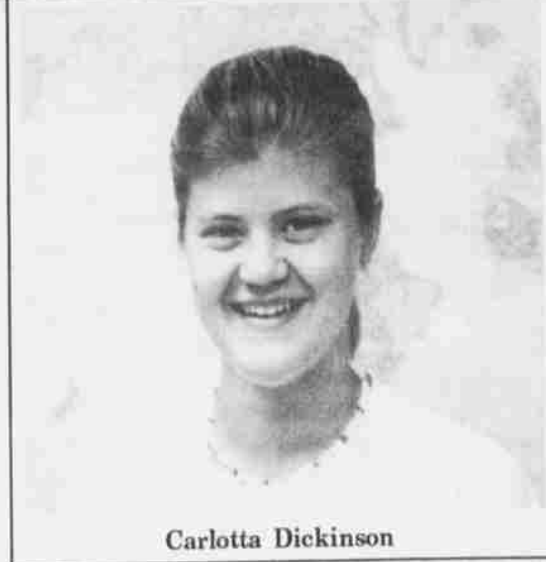

Soccer team loses two over weekend

On Friday Oct. 5, the UNLV Rebel soccer team was defeated by Big West opponent, Cal State Fullerton, 2-1. Two days later, the Rebels lost to No. 1 ranked UCLA, also 2-1.

The first half of the game against the Titans, was a stalemate, with four shots on goal by each team. Finally, at 55:00 of the second half, the Rebels got on the scoreboard when All-America senior forward Doug Borgel took a pass from freshman forward Ben Erickson and shot it past goalkeeper Jay Nettekoven from 20 yards out.

However, that would be the last time the Rebels scored. The Titans responded twice, scoring their first goal at 63:00 when midfielder T.C. Valentine followed a blocked shot and put it into the

goal from 4 yards out. Their second goal, by forward Paul Haro came on a header that was out of the reach of Rebel junior goalkeeper Emmet Mielbrecht at 81:00.

The Rebels finished with 11 shots, but only five of them on goal. With this victory, the Titans avenged an earlier loss suffered here in Las Vegas.

The Rebels dropped to 5-4-2, 2-2 in conference play, while the Titans improved to 4-5-2, 2-2.

The Sunday game matched the stumbling Rebels against UCLA, the No. 1 team in the nation. Despite one of their best performances of the season, the Rebels suffered their fourth loss on the five-game road trip.

The Bruins out shot the Rebels 13-2 in the first half, but the outstanding play of freshman goalkeeper Dan Schell, kept the ball out of the goal.

At 58:18 of the second half, midfielder Joe Max Moore of UCLA, put a penalty kick past Schell for the first goal of the game. The Bruins tacked up another goal at 61:25 when midfielder Cobi Jones took a pass and scored from 12 yards out.

The Rebels tried to mount a comeback, but all they could get was one goal four minutes later. The goal was scored by junior forward Terry Pryer on a pass from junior forward Jerry Pribil.

The defeat dropped the Rebels to .500 overall, 5-5-2, 2-2 in conference, while the Bruins improved to 9-0-3.

The Rebels will resume play at home on Friday Oct. 12 at 7 p.m. and Sunday Oct. 14 at 1 p.m. in the UNLV Coors Classic, in which they will play Big West opponents, UC Irvine and UC Santa Barbara.

UNLV basketball players speak out

The UNLV basketball team called a press conference Tuesday afternoon, to give their position on Head Coach Jerry Tarkanian's offer to step down during the 1991 NCAA Tournament.

Senior guard, Greg Anthony, read from a statement prepared by the players:

"We met with Coach Tark yesterday. We appreciate what the coach said, but we don't feel what's happening is fair or justified. After talking to our lawyer, Steve Stein, we would like to say the following:

We are a team. We are a close team, but more so, we are a family. Coach Tark is not only part of our family, he is the head of our family. He is like a father to all of us.

We do respect Coach Tark's feelings and his decision. However, we urge the NCAA to allow our family to remain whole and compete with Coach Tark.

Our family went through a lengthy and difficult time together, with the NCAA last year. Each of us was interviewed several times by investigators from

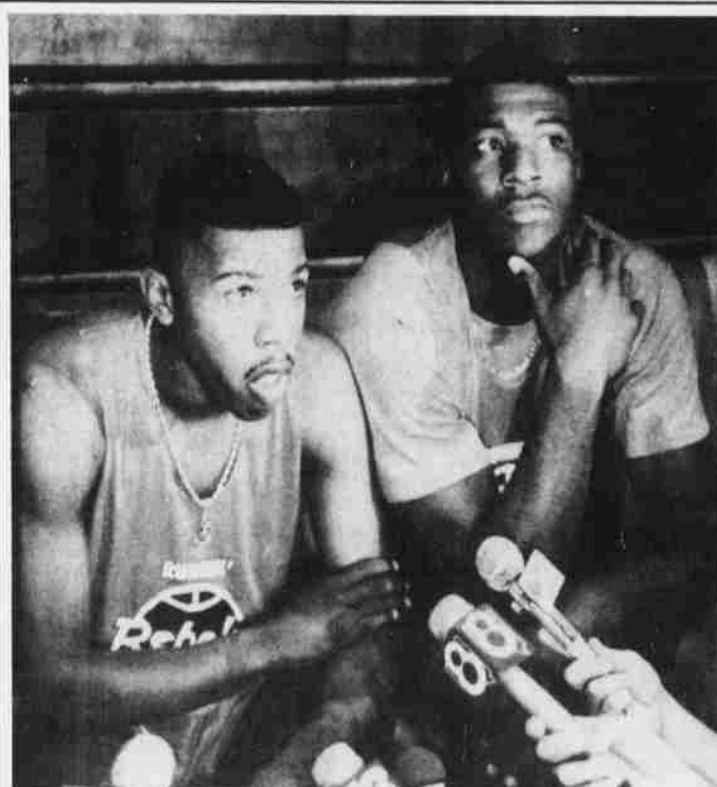
the NCAA. We know of no wrongdoing by us, the coaches or the university.

Our family came to play, we want to play, let us play together!"

Anthony said he was not surprised by Tarkanian's offer. He said Tarkanian had suggested such a move earlier. The players

were against the idea because Tarkanian "would, in effect, have to concede to something that he had not done wrong," said Anthony.

Anthony and senior forward, Larry Johnson both reiterated that they would prefer not to play without Coach Tarkanian.
