Nuke waste opponents walk against dump

Citizen Alert will hold the second annual Walk Against Waste on Sunday, Oct. 21, at 1 p.m. This 10-kilometer walkathon, which raises money for the fight against the nuclear waste dump proposed for Yucca Mountain, will begin and end at the patio of the Moyer Student Union at UNLV.

"We've had some big successes in our battle to prevent Nevada from becoming the dumping-ground of the entire nation's nuclear trash," said Marla Hollander Pollot, co-chair of the Walk Against Waste. "But now more than ever we've got to keep the pressure on, to demonstrate to the DOE (Department of Energy) and the U.S. Congress that Nevadans have no intention of accepting the dump,

and that the entire process of site selection has been a farce."

"Walking against waste is a concrete action we can take to preserve the health and safety of our community," said Pollot.

Any walker who raises more than \$10 in sponsorships will receive Walk Against Waste T-shirt. The walkathon will conclude with a picnic on the lawn of the Student Union.

"The most important goal is to initially provide UNLV students the best service possible while maintaining compliance with federal, state, and institutional laws and guidelines which continually change from year to year," Belanger said.

Two problems Belanger foresees in the future are insufficient staffing and computing support.

"It's difficult to manage the level of service with the increasing student population without additional staff members," Belanger said. "Additional computing support will help in providing more information and better processing, and help to eliminate time-consuming manual tasks therefore increasing the availability of more counselors."

Financial services currently

has a "good foundation" according to Belanger and this provides a lot of latitude to build on what has already been established.

Many times students become discouraged with mountains of paperwork and miles of red tape associated in acquiring financial aid.

Belanger said that this can be a contributing factor and "many times the complexities do interfere with prospective applicants creating unnecessary confusion." Working with the Department of Education will hopefully simplify the process.

Improvement in simplicity of application, and an increase in available funds for students will result in an overall higher count of students who actually receive money. Currently there is a significant discrepancy in the num-

ber of students who apply for financial aid, as opposed to those actually receiving assistance. (An exact figure of those students receiving aide and unapproved applicants is not available at this time.)

Other services Belanger hopes to initiate through her office include outreach programs, parent financial planning seminars and a financial aid planning center.

In a quick assessment of her surroundings and first impressions at UNLV she said, "student financial services has a strong staff, strong office, and I'm excited about this office and pursued changes. I'm also looking to gather increased support for students."

Memorial services held for UNLV English professor

UNLV English professor Lewis Arlen Collier died in his home last Friday. He was 57.

Collier had been associate professor of English since 1969 and had served as department chair from 1970 to 1973.

Collier received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of California, Santa Barbara and his doctorate from

the University of Washington. At UNLV, he had been named teacher of the year in 1989 and was a winner of the Rita Deanin Abbey Humanities Teaching Award.

Collier taught Shakespeare, Renaissance literature, mythology, drama, culture and art through the ages, film composition and technical writing courses

were taught at the university.

Memorial services were held Wednesday at University Methodist Church.
