Rebels avoid scare, beat New Mexico State in closing minutes

New Mexico State, the doormat of the Big West when it comes to football, a team with the nation's longest losing streak at 22 games going into Saturday night's matchup against UNLV, a team that UNLV had beaten in all previous meetings.

Yet, Saturday night, in front of a crowd of 10,267 at Aggie Memorial Stadium in Las Cruces, N.M. the Rebels had to come back in the closing minutes to pull out a 24-20 victory. The win marked the third in a row for UNLV, and raised its overall record to 4-3, along with a 3-1 record in Big West play.

As with the previous week against Cal State Fullerton, the Rebels' special teams, along with a strong outing by the defense, helped provide the margin of victory for UNLV.

In the first quarter, the Rebels were able to get on the scoreboard first with Marvin Eastman's 1-yard run at the 10:08 mark. Eastman would end up leading all rushers for the game with 113 yards on 25 carries.

Three minutes later UNLV increased its lead to 10-0, on a 21-yard field goal by Todd Amrein. The drive started when David Clarke recovered a fumble that enabled UNLV's offense to take possession at the New Mexico State 37.

In the second quarter, the Aggies were able to close the gap when David Chisum hit Richard Sanchez for a 10-yard touchdown pass. A few minutes later New Mexico State took the lead when Chisum threw another touchdown pass, this time to Ezell Brown. At this point the Rebels were down for the first time 14-10.

The play of UNLV's special teams kicked in with 3:59 left in the first half. Third-string tight end Morris Taylor was able to get

through and block Garret Henson's punt. It was the first blocked punt recorded by UNLV this season, and the Rebels recovered the ball at the New Mexico State 20. Six plays later, all-purpose back Hunkie Cooper scored on a 1-yard run. Amrein's point after was good, and for the second straight game, UNLV went into the second half with a lead, 17-14.

Late in the third quarter, UNLV's Stacey Monroe was assessed 30 yards in penalties on personal foul and face masking calls. The Aggies then drove the ball 58 yards and tied the game when Dat Ly kicked a 39-yard field goal.

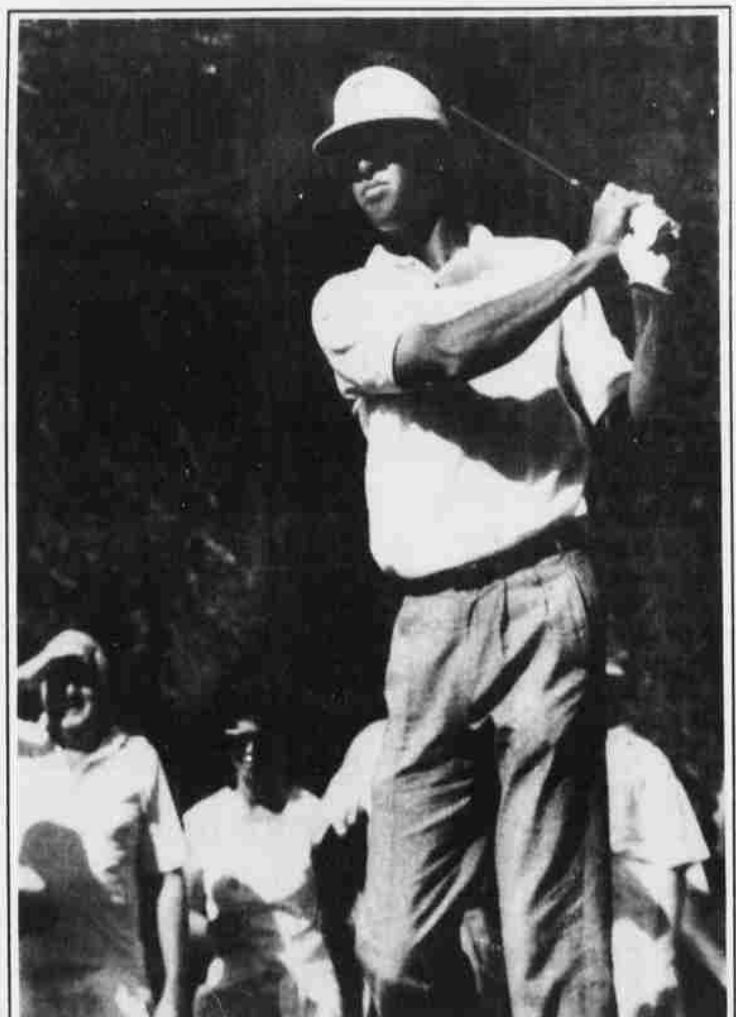
With 7:36 left in the fourth quarter, Ly kicked another field goal, this time from 42 yards, and New Mexico State recaptured the lead 20-17.

Coach Strong in a desperate attempt to pull his team together, had a meeting on the 50-yard line before the next kickoff. He told the team they were winners and that they were going to win the game. The Rebels drove 71 yards in 10 plays and pulled out the victory when Derek Stott ran it in from 14 yards out. Earlier in the drive Stott hooked up with Cooper for a pass play that covered 18 yards.

Stott finished the game with 116 yards in the air on 10 completions with no interceptions. Cooper on the other hand finished the game with 158 total yards.

UNLV's defense was able to hold New Mexico State for the remaining 3:30 of the game, and the Rebels had their third win in a row.

Next week UNLV will be facing intrastate rival Nevada-Reno in a non-conference game at the Silver Bowl for homecoming. UNLV will be seeking revenge for last year's humiliating 45-7 loss and fighting for the coveted cannon.
