Willy Brandt next Barrick lecturer

Former chairman of West Germany's Democratic Party to discuss reunification

Willy Brandt, the former chairman of West Germany's Social Democratic Party, will speak on the reunification of Germany in UNLV's next Barrick Lecture Series presentation, Oct. 29 at 7:30 p.m. in Artemus W. Ham Concert Hall.

The lecture is free and open to the public, but tickets are required. Tickets will be available to the public beginning Oct. 20 at the UNLV Performing Arts Center Box Office. Brandt was born in Lubeck, Germany, in 1913. During the rise of the Nazi regime, Brandt resisted fascism and became active in the Young Socialist Movement. Fleeing from Nazi persecution, Brandt left Germany and continued his work with the socialist movement.

While in exile, Brandt worked as a political observer and a representative of humanitarian re-

lief organizations.

Beginning his political career in 1948, Brandt held various offices within the Social Democratic Party. He served as governing mayor of Berlin from 1957 until 1966.

In 1964, Brandt was named chairman of the Social Democratic Party of Germany, a position he held for 23 years. While chairman of the party, Brandt also served as foreign minister vice chancellor, and federal chancellor of Germany.

The author of numerous books and articles, Brandt received the 1971 Nobel Peace Prize for "Ostpolitik," his policy of reconciliation with Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union.

Now in its tenth anniversary season, the Barrick Lecture Series was created in 1980 through an endowment established by Marjorie Barrick in honor of her late husband, Edward. The interest from the endowment funds the lecture series, graduate fellowships, a faculty development and

travel fund, and a faculty research fund.

Barrick is a member of the board of trustees of the UNLV Foundation. Honored as a Distinguished Nevadan in 1982, she received the Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree from UNLV in 1985. UNLV's Marjorie Barrick Museum of Natural History was named in honor of the long-time university benefactor in 1989.

University Regent candidates voice concern over issues

The regionally elected board is responsible for all statewide public higher education

As the days draw closer to the November 6 election, the race between District C, University Regent Shelley Berkley and her opponent Madison Graves II heats up.

Graves, a Las Vegas developer who refers to Berkley as an ultimate politician, said the Board of Regents needs someone with business experience to help analyze the two year budget that will be in excess of \$500 million.

Berkley, an attorney and former assemblywoman pointed out, "I have legislative experience. We need to lobby our legislature to give us what we ask for."

According to Berkley, the most important issues that the regents will be concerned with is the adequate funding for the entire university system, particularly to UNLV where all the

growth is occurring.

Graves said he would like a construction coordinator for the university system to oversee all building plans and prevent delay in construction. He supports a law school at UNLV, according to the feasibility study. He said he believes the budget process needs to be revamped. He would push for UNLV to receive its fair share, and he believes the University System must be run like a business.

In addition Graves said, "We need to create a business situation and we have to service the needs of the students."

The incumbent Berkley also supports a law school at UNLV. She said the first priority for UNLV is adequate buildings on campus. She said she believes the citizens, students, faculty and alumni should lobby for adequate funding and that UNLV should receive its fair share.

Twenty percent of Nevada's overall budget goes to the university system. Every two years the board of regents submits a budget to the governor for approval. The budget must then be approved and sent to the legislature for final approval.

The University of Nevada Board of Regents consists of nine members; five from Clark County, two from Washoe County, and two from rural counties. The regionally-elected governing board is responsible for all statewide public higher education, and sets public policy as opposed to administration policy.

During the last few weeks of the race, the public will be bombarded with political advertisements, radio announcements, literature, billboards, and many more name recognition tactics. The outcome of the next District C Board of Regent race lies in the hands of the voters.

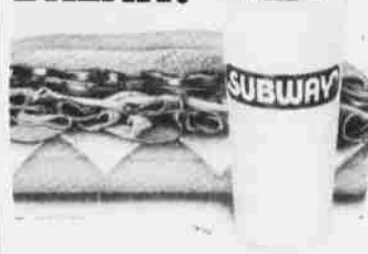
