Student taps into campus computer to counterfeit checks

EAST LANSING, Mich. (CPS)—The U.S. Secret Service charged a Michigan State University student and a friend with using MSU's computers since July to manufacture fake cashier's checks worth more than \$50,000.

Officials said student Anthony Grewel, 21, and friend David Martin, 23, scanned bank logos into a campus Macintosh

computer and, using a common illustration program, allegedly printed counterfeit cashier's checks on a laser printer.

In announcing the arrest Oct. 16, a Secret Service spokesman said the two had used the cash to buy a bicycle, some ski equipment, a dining room set and a \$17,000 computer.
