context of home schooling, national and statewide trends, and the implications of home schools for future research and policymaking. Specifically, Mayberry will address the reasons why home schooling has recently become a popular educational alternative, and she will discuss the motivations and rationale of parents who educate their children at home. Mayberry earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in sociology from the University of Nevada, Reno, and she earned her doctorate degree in sociology from the University of Oregon in 1988.

The author of numerous scholarly articles about home schooling, Mayberry has been awarded a two-year grant from the U.S. Department of Education to assess home schools in three western states. She is also the co-author of a forthcoming book, titled "Environments for Effective Education." The University Forum Series is sponsored each semester by UNLV's College of Liberal Arts. Mayberry's lecture is being co-sponsored by the UNLV Foundation.
