Upcoming tribute concert for Big Brothers & Big Sisters of Southern Nevada

The newly founded Student Public Relations Organization at UNLV will host a tribute concert for Big Brothers & Big Sisters of Southern Nevada with the UNLV Community Concert Band and the University Wind Ensemble, Nov. 20 at 8 p.m., at the Artemus Ham Hall.

"As a public relations student organization, we are concerned about the PR in our community. Las Vegas is a city that has many excellent resources available, such as Big Brothers & Big Sisters, yet few people tend to utilize them," SPRO President Carol Rhodes said. "The Big Brothers & Big Sisters program in Las Vegas is a fantastic one that we feel doesn't receive enough support and recognition from the community, which is why we felt a tribute holiday concert was an ideal way to bring everyone together."

She added that UNLV is a community like Las Vegas in that there are many quality programs available to the public which are not used. An example of this is the free events held in Artemus Ham Hall throughout the year.

"This will really be a fun event for the matches (bigs and littles) to attend because they will mutually benefit from the concert," Big Brothers & Big Sisters

Special Projects Coordinator Monica Langlands said. "The littles will be able to talk with some of the musicians and experiment with their instruments, while the bigs will be able to sit back and enjoy the performance."

In celebration of the holidays, the tribute concert will be filled with festive music. University Wind Ensemble Conductor Tom Leslie said, "For the first time, we are going to perform holiday pieces that we've been quite excited about."

This is the first time the UNLV Community Concert Band and the University Wind Ensemble are planning to perform in the same night. Each group will play a 45-minute set of seasonal music.

Children from the Clark County School District will be participating in this community event by displaying their work in an exhibit in the foyer of Artemus Ham Hall.

Members of SPRO are cordially inviting the community of Las Vegas to join in this festive fun filled evening. This event is free to the public. Tickets are given out on a first come, first serve basis on the night of the performance.
