On an evening of festive music, the Student Public Relations Organization (SPRO), together with the UNLV Community Concert Band and the University Wind ensemble gave a holiday concert for the benefit of Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Southern Nevada.

Artemus Ham Concert Hall was the gathering site for lots of "little brothers and sisters" who were allowed, before the show, to see, touch and even play the instruments. Musicians guided the children with information concerning their musical tools while excited youngsters tapped on the drums and pushed the keys of trumpets. Cookies and punch were served at the reception.

Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Southern Nevada is a private, non-profit organization which matches adult volunteers with children from single parent families. These volunteers provide the children with friendship, guidance and a positive role model. Nationally, over 470 Big Brother/Big Sister agencies provide volunteer role models for over 100,000 youth each year. Service to youth is

Safety shuttle service is available

The Department of Public Safety at UNLV has been providing a safety shuttle for almost three months. Parking enforcement officers are available to drive students from any location on campus to their cars. The shuttle runs Monday through Thursday from dusk until midnight. Students can dial 3668 from any campus phone to call the shuttle. The shuttle usually takes between two and 15 minutes.

Although campus crime is a concern, only a small number of students take advantage of the free shuttle service. Less than 20 students ride the shuttle nightly, mainly because of lack of student awareness.

"It can be dangerous for a girl to walk alone at night. I wish I had known about the shuttle be-

fore now," said Susan Hanratty, business major.

Students attending night classes are not the only people who can benefit from the service. Many students who study late into the evening at the library can call the shuttle. Males are also encouraged to call.

Parking enforcement officers wear a uniform to distinguish themselves. The shuttle is also distinguishable because of its parking enforcement stickers.

Shuttle Driver Scott Ziegler said that he feels his "UNLV Express" is a great option for students who don't want to chance walking alone at night.

Students should remember that the shuttle does not work on Friday, Saturday or Sunday. However, Ziegler said he has received positive feedback and welcomes suggestions from students.
