In his lecture, Bigler will explain the origin, nature, and development of white racial domination in the Republic of South Africa. He will analyze the reasons why the system of apartheid is now being gradually dismantled, and the role of the United States in this process

Bigler will also discuss American and Western interests at stake in South Africa, and the impact of the reforms undertaken recently.

To conclude the lecture, Bigler will present possible scenarios for the transition from white minority domination to a multiracial, multicultural, and multilingual democratic South Africa based on the equality of all its citizens.

Bigler specializes in comparative politics and comparative foreign policy. He was educated at the University of Budapest, Hungary, and at the University of California, Berkeley, where he


