

# McCardell ends season with impressive statistics

For the third consecutive season the UNLV gridiron combatants ended with a final count of 4-7, but Keenan McCardell, senior wide receiver, compiled final 1990 statistics which read like this:

In 11 games, he had 68 receptions for 1,046 yards (the eighth highest total in Division I-A this year).

He ranked second in the Big West with 95.1 receiving yards per game, and his 6.2 catches per game were the highest in the league.

He ranks near the top of all major UNLV receiving categories. His 141 career receptions tie him for second on the all-time list. He had career totals of 2,189 yards receiving and 15 touchdowns.

These are pretty impressive statistics. With them, one would seem to be assured of being picked in the upcoming 1991 National Football League draft, but McCardell would view any such event as a "dream that came true".

In speaking with McCardell about his most memorable moment in a UNLV uniform, he replied, "Oh, it would have to be my first touchdown against New

Mexico State. I suppose its true that you never forget your first."

When asked where he thought he would go with the draft, he said, "Just to be included in the draft, just to be drafted and play in the NFL would be a dream come true."

With deeper questioning, McCardell said his real hope would be to play for the world champion San Francisco 49ers.

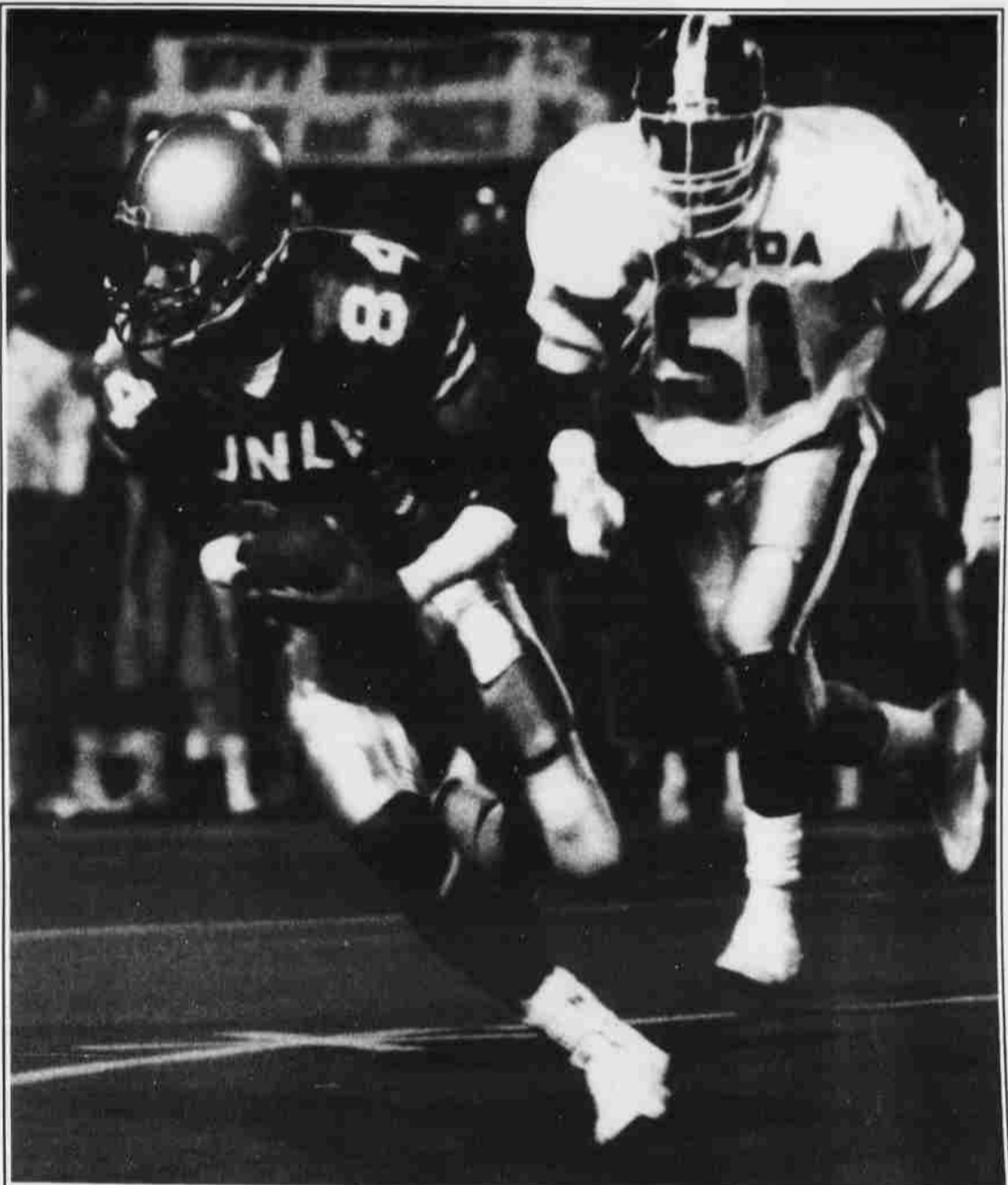
"Jerry Rice is my hero, and I would say I've tried to emulate his style of play," he said. "To be on the receiving end of (Joe) Montana's passes would be great, but I'll play for anyone in the NFL."

McCardell said, "I'm looking forward to the challenge. You have to get respect on the field. I like to be challenged. It's like anything you do, you have to get respect. Life is full of challenges."

McCardell is on line to graduate in 3 1/2 years with a degree in business management, yet another impressive statistic.
