"When it rains, this makes for a large bathtub," Weide said. The university corroborated Weide's theory.

Weide said he is certain the building is not currently sinking. He is sure the settling occurred within the first few years after

construction. The roof, however, has continued to leak for the past 18 years.

Structurally, nothing can be done to level the building, according to Weide, although the leaking roof can be fixed.

"What is needed is a new roofing structure, like on a house, so water will no longer collect in that corner of the building," Weide said.

Although Weide has brought the leakage problem to the university's attention many times over the past 18 years, no progress has been made to correct the problem.

John R. Amend, director of the Physical Plant Department, is responsible for the maintenance of campus structures. Amend said the geoscience building's leaking roof is not the worst roof on campus.

"New roofs are needed on the library, White Hall and Ham Fine Arts Center," Amend said.

Amend estimated that \$725,000 has been spent over the past year fixing defective campus roofs. He estimated the structure needed to correct to leakage problem at the Lily Fong building will cost \$125,000.

Weide said he had been promised the roof would be fixed week after week for the past year.

The Lily Fong Geoscience building's roof restructuring is scheduled to be "bid out" to outside architects on Jan. 8, 1991, according to Amend.

"This time next year, we won't have this problem," Amend said. He also said that if Weide has been complaining of this problem for the past 18 years, "he must have a great deal of patience."

"The university must move quickly to build a new structure (on the roof) so there is no more bathtub," Weide said.

Legend of Shangri-La lecture to be held

UNLV English Professor Felicia Campbell will discuss the origin of the legend of Shangri-La and its influence on people today during the next University Forum Series lecture Dec. 5, 7:30 p.m., in UNLV's John S. Wright Hall, Room 116.

According to Campbell, Tibetans and other Easterners have believed for centuries in Shambhala, an ideal kingdom hidden in the Himalayas and gov-

erned by philosopher kings. Since James Hilton's novel "Lost Horizon" was published in 1933, Westerners have yearned for Shangri-La, a utopian society hidden in the Himalayas.

Campbell will include in her lecture a slide presentation of her own search for Shangri-La in the Karakoram range of the Himalayas.

An associate professor of English, Campbell has published

two articles on the subject in the scholarly journals "Philological Papers" and "Utopian Studies."

The University Forum Series is sponsored each semester by UNLV's College of Arts and Letters. Campbell's presentation, which is free and open to the public, is also being sponsored by the UNLV Foundation.
