# Classified Council recommends students park only in T&M

Last week, the Yellin' Rebel received the following letter:

*Dear Editor:*  
*These minutes have some very dangerous thoughts within them. It seems that a few faculty/staff employees have forgotten why they are employed. They are more interested on how to make parking easier for themselves, while not being concerned for the student's accessibility.*

*Please print the highlighted sections, possibly something should be written about these minutes, it's up to you. . .*

The following has been taken from the Classified Staff Council minutes from November 13, 1990 meeting.

Ron Milne, Chairman, Parking and Traffic Control Committee, told the council that doing

Robert Maxson, with its recommendations concerning parking and traffic control policies. The memo read as follows:

The Classified Staff Council would like to make the following recommendations to your committee prior to your sending forward any proposals to the President:

We recommend the elimination of student parking in the immediate vicinity of campus buildings and that these spaces be reserved for Faculty/Staff parking only. . . .

We recommend that all students be required to park in the TMC parking lots (and later the proposed lots off Swenson), and that possibly a shuttle service be established. . . .

We are strongly opposed to any plan that would create Faculty Only parking areas. Most major university campuses have

would have adequate parking for both faculty and staff. . . .

The next meeting of the Classified Staff Council will be on Tuesday, December 11, 1990.

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nothing in regards to our present and future parking problems is not a viable option. True participation from everyone on campus will be necessary. Some of the problems mentioned were: the need for coordination during times of special events, imposing our problem on neighbors by parking in their spaces, growth on North side of campus, lack of parking for faculty who come in late and the shrinking of current parking as new buildings go up. . . .

The Council drafted a memo to be sent to Ron Milne, Parking and Traffic Control Committee, copies of which will be sent to the Faculty Senate and President

combined Faculty/Staff parking lots, and seem to have no problem with that. To create any type of situation that would erect another barrier between faculty and staff on this campus is a counterproductive idea and one that we are sure the President, who has always stressed unity on campus, would not endorse. . . .

We recommend the elimination of reserved parking spaces on campus for such things as CSUN, GSA, and Faculty Senate members. . . .

We feel that by elimination student parking near campus buildings, and having card-operated gates for faculty/staff, you
