

UNLV 95, Mich State 75 Dec. 15.

UNLV head basketball coach Jerry Tarkanian became the NCAA's all-time winningest coach (by percentage) with the Rebels' win over the then-20th-ranked Spartans at The Palace in Auburn Hills, Mich.

Larry Johnson led UNLV with a career-high 35 points and

14 rebounds.

The Rebels (3-0), facing their first real test of the season, looked sluggish at times and the Spartans briefly took the lead, 61-60, early in the second half.

A technical foul on Greg Anthony sparked the Runnin' Rebels, however, as they put together a 21-5 run and cruised to the 20point win.

### UNLV 69, Princeton 35 Dec.19

The Rebels hosted Princeton, college basketball's reknowned giant-killers, in their first home game of the season. However, Princeton's methodical offense and hold the big, strong, fast Runnin' Rebels in check.
