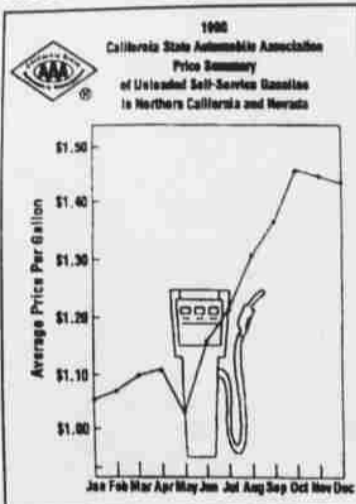

Gas prices down

The California State Automobile Association reports that January



ary 1991's unleaded self-service gas prices are averaging \$1.33 per gallon, down 10.9 cents since last month's survey.

This is the third consecutive month that gas prices have gone down since the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait on Aug. 2, according to the CSAA's survey of 600 gas retailers in northern and central California and the state of Nevada.

The highest CSAA average survey price ever recorded for unleaded self-service gasoline was \$1.48 in July 1981.
