The *New York Times* wrote "The TB-AIDS Diary" takes its viewers beyond the medical and demographic statistics of two deadly diseases, beyond the obituary columns, to explore the societal implications of the disease for individual victims."

The "TB-AIDS Diary" was recently the kick-off exhibition at the first university student AIDS

conference in Mexico for Dec. 1 Worldwide AIDS Day. The "TB-AIDS Diary" won the Friends of Photography Ferguson Award in 1989 and is exhibited in the U.S. and abroad.

Troeller is an activist artist and magazine editorial photographer based in Lawrenceville, N.J. She is teaching Extended Documentary Photography classes in the art department's photo program this month.
