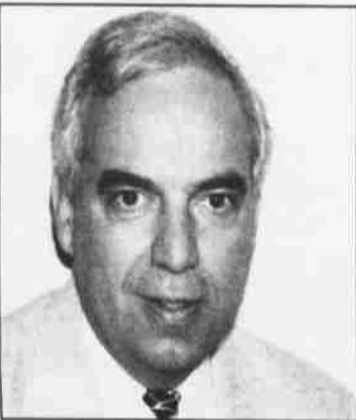
Stress control in your everyday life and in specific situations

Andrew Nixon awarded



UNLV Athletic Administrator Andrew Nixon was honored with this year's Distinguished Service Award by the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics.

Nixon has dedicated the past 23 years to working with young

people. Currently, he is Institutional Coordinator for the College Student-Athlete project at UNLV, which is part of a Presidential Task Force studying at the athletic department.

Nixon has authored NCAA legislative proposals, served as chair of the Accreditation and Certification Commission and as editor of the Academic Athletic Journal.

Store fixtures design contest

Student designers can win up to \$10,000 in prize money and be exhibited at the prestigious National Association of Display Industries trade show in New York City, in a contest sponsored by HBSA Industries Incorporated.

Called "DesignQuest '91," the contest is open to all students enrolled in architecture, design, industrial design, store planning and visual merchandising courses for the retail trade.

Contestants will design a freestanding merchandising fixture for housing and displaying retail merchandise in one of three categories: clothing, electronics or women's accessories. Materials must be metal, wood or a combination of the two.

First prize will be \$10,000, second prize is \$5,000 and third prize is \$2,500. All entries must be received at the HBSA Showroom, 860 Broadway, New York, NY by 5 p.m. Feb. 28.

Winners will be notified by March 27 and will be provided free travel and accommodations to New York for the awards presentation on April 26.
