*Summer fellowship program*

This spring six to ten college undergraduates from across the nation will be awarded scholarships to attend the Historic Deerfield Summer Fellowship Program in early American history and material culture. For the 36th year, a select group of students will live in Deerfield, Mass., from mid-June to mid-August while participating in an intensive examination of early American history, architecture, decorative arts, museum interpretation and operations.

Each applicant appointed to the program is awarded a \$4,100 fellowship, which covers tuition, books and field expenses. The fee for room and board for nine weeks is \$1300. Financial aid for room and board is available.

The Uno-Montpellier Summer School is a four-week program of intensive instruction in French language and culture that will be offered from July 2 - July 30 in Montpellier, France. College students who have completed at least two semesters or six credit hours of French and are in good standing at their universities are eligible to apply. Students may receive 3 to 6 hours of credit for their coursework.

An optional post-study tour is

available to all participants from July 31 - Aug. 5 and features travel by train to Paris, as well as to such achievements of French culture as the chateaux of the Loire Valley; the palace of Versailles and the cathedral of Chartres.
